AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 7001 OF THE GOVERNMENT CUDE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF LAW OF THE COVERNMENT OF GUAM MAY NOT DELEGATE ANY OF ITS RESPONSIBILITY OVER LITIGATION INVOLVING THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM TO ANY ATTORNEY IN PRIVATE PRACTICE.

BE IT EMACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 7001 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 7001. Department of Law, cognizance. The Department of Law shall have cognizance of all legal matters in which the government of Guam is in anywise interested. Neither the Attorney General nor the Island Attorney shall delegate to any attorney in private practice in Guam the collection of any account or other obligation owing to the government of Guam, or to say agency or instrumentality thereof. It shall have cognizance of all matters pertaining to public prosecution. For this purpose the Island Attorney, deputy Island Attorneys and all employees of the Island Attorney's office shall form the prosecution division of the Department of Law and are placed under the jurisdiction of the Attorney General." Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
