AN ACT TO ADD CHAPTER IV TO TITLE VII OF PART II OF THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM TO AUTHORIZE THE EXTENSION OF PRISONERS' CONFINEMENT LIMITS UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Chapter IV is hereby added to Title VII of Part II of the Penal Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Chapter IV

EXTENSION OF LIMITS OF CONFINEMENT

Section 1234.1. Extension of Limits of Confinement. The Director of Public Safety may extend the limits of the place of confinement of a prisoner entrusted to his custody as to whom there is reasonable cause to believe he will honor his trust, by authorizing him, under prescribed conditions, to visit a specifically designated place or places for a period not to exceed twenty—four hours and return to the institution. An extension of limits may be granted only, to permit a visit to a dying relative, attendance at the funeral of a relative, the obtaining of medical services not otherwise available, or for any other compelling reason consistent with the public interest.

Safety may also extend the limits of confinement of such a prisoner as is described in Section 1234.1 by authorizing him, under prescribed conditions, to visit a specifically designated place or places for a period not to exceed nine hours and return to the same. An extension of limits, under this section may be granted only to permit the extension or continuance of a prisoner's education, to contact a prospective employer, to work at paid employment while continuing as a prisoner of the Guam Penitentiary; provided, that:

- (b) Such paid employment will not result in the displacement of employed workers, or be applied in skills, crafts, or trades in which there is a surplus of available gainful labor in the territory, or impair existing contracts for services; and
- (c) The rates of pay and other conditions of employment will not be less than those paid or provided for work of similar nature in the territory.

Section 1234.3. Repayment of Costs of Confinement. A prisoner authorized to work at paid employment in the territory under Section 1234.2 may be required to pay, and the Director of Public Safety is authorized to collect, such costs incident to the prisoner's confinement as the Director of Public Safety deems appropriate and reasonable. Collections shall be deposited in the General Fund of the Treasury of Guam.

Section 1234.4. Failure to Conform: Punishment. The wilful failure of a prisoner to remain within the extended limits of his confinement, as authorized by the provisions of this Chapter, or to return within the time prescribed to the institution shall be deemed as escape from the custody of the Director of Public Safety punishable under Section 105 of this Code."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
