AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 6110 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO AUTHORIZE THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM TO SELL ITS SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY, OR TO DONATE THE SAME TO CHARITABLE OR CIVIC ORGANIZATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 6110 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 6110. Property Survey. When property has become unserviceable through wear and tear or otherwise, the same will be submitted for the action of the board of survey, appointed by the Covernor, after lists have been prepared in triplicate by the responsible officer or agent. The report of the board of survey, when approved, shall be filed as a voucher with the property return of the accountable officer. If the report shows the property to have become unserviceable and surplus to the needs of the government, then the property may be sold to the highest bidder. If such property cannot be sold, then it may be donated to local charitable, social or civic associations. The Director of Finance shall make rules and regulations, to be effective upon approval by the Governor and promulgation by Executive Order, to carry out the provisions of this section, the purpose of which is declared to be to provide for the orderly disposition of no longer serviceable government property."
