Committee on Rules, by request of the Governor in accordance with Section 6(b) of the Organic Act of Guam.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE MINIMUM WAGE AND HOUR ACT OF GUAM, TITLE XLII, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, EXTENDING THE COVERAGE OF THE ACT, INCREASING THE MINIMUM WAGE, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Sections 46006 through 46017 of Chapter 1, Title XLII, Government Code of Guam, wherever mentioned in said Title, are hereby renumbered Sections 46007 through 46018, except that the reference in Subsection 46003(6) to Section 46014 (as renumbered) is renumbered 46014 and the reference in Section 46009 (as renumbered to Section 46007) as renumbered is renumbered 46008.

- Section 2. Item 4 of Section 46003, Government Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - "4. 'Employee! includes any individual employed by an employer, but shall not include any individual employed: (a) in agriculture for any workweek in which the employer of the individual employs less than 10 persons; (b) in domestic employment in or about a private home."
- Section 3. Item 6 of Section 46003, Government Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - may provide under Section 46014) legal tender of the United States, or checks on banks convertible into cash on demand at full face value thereof and in addition thereto the reasonable cost, as determined by the Commissioner, to the employer of furnishing an employee with board, lodging or other facilities if such board,

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lodging or other facilities are customarily furnished by such employer to his employees but shall not include tips or gratuities of any kind: Provided, that the cost of board, lodging or other facilities shall not be included as a part of the wage paid to any employee to the extent it is excluded therefrom under the terms of a bona fide collective bargaining agreement applicable to the particular employee."

Section 4. Section 46004, Government Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 46004. Minimum Wages. Every employer shall pay to each employee employed by him wages at the rate of not less than \$1.40 per hour."

Section 5. A new Section 46006 is hereby added to Chapter 1, Title XLII, Government Code, to read as follows:

"Section 46006. Exemptions. The provisions of Sections 46004 and 46005 shall not apply with respect to: (a) any employee employed by his son, daughter, spouse or parent; (b) any employee employed in a bona fide executive, administrative or professional capacity, or in the capacity of outside salesman, or as an outside collector; (c) any employee employed in the propagating, catching, taking, harvesting, cultivating or farming of any kind of fish, shellfish, crustacea, sponges, seaweeds or other acquatic forms of animal or vegetable life, including the going to and returning from work and the loading and unloading of such products prior to first processing; (d) any employee employed as a seaman; (e) any employee employed as a driver of a vehicle carrying passengers for hire operated solely on call from a fixed stand; (f) any employee employed as a golf caddy; (g) any employee employed as a newspaper boy in the delivery of newspapers to the consumer; (h) any student enrolled in a public or private school of Guam employed during a school summer vacation; or (i) any

employee to the extent that such employee is exempted by the Commissioner pursuant to Sections 46011 and 46012."

Section 6. Section 46008, Government Code, as renumbered by Section 1 hereof, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 46008. Employer's Record; Commissioner's Rights and Duties. Every employer shall keep in or about the premises wherein any employee is employed a record of the name, address and occupation of each such employee, of the amount paid each pay period to each such employee, of the hours worked each day and each workweek by each employee, and of such other information, and for such periods of time as the Commissioner may by regulation prescribe. The Commissioner or his authorized representative shall, for the purpose of examination, have access to, and the right to copy from, such records. The Commissioner is authorized to inspect and use as evidence all reports and/or statements of any kind or nature submitted to any department of the government of Guam for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this chapter. Every employer shall furnish to the Commissioner or his authorized representative such information relating to the employment of workers and in such manner as the Commissioner may prescribe, and shall permit the Commissioner or his representative to interview employees during working hours at the place of employment. The Commissioner shall cause this chapter to be printed and copies thereof shall be furnished to interested persons upon request without charge. Copies of orders of the Commissioner and of rules and regulations of the Commissioner shall also be furnished to employers affected thereby without charge."

Section 7. Section 46014, Government Code, as renumbered by Section 1 hereof, is hereby smended to read as follows:

"Section 46014. Administrative Regulations. For any

occupation, the Commissioner shall make and revise, subject to the approval of the Governor, such administrative regulations as he may deem appropriate to carry out the purposes of this Chapter or necessary to prevent the circumvention or evasion thereof and to safeguard the minimum wage rates thereby established. Such regulations may include, but are not limited to, regulations defining and governing outside salesmen; learners and apprentices, their number, proportion, and length of service; part-time pay; handicapped workers; bomuses; overtime pay; special pay for special or extra work; permitted charges to employees or allowances for board, lodging, or other facilities customarily furnished by employers to employees; or allowances for such other special conditions or circumstances which may be usual in a particular employer-employee relationship. Regulations or revisions thereof pursuant to this section shall be made only after a public hearing subsequent to publication of notice of the hearing, at which any person may be heard. Such regulations or revisions shall, except as may otherwise be provided, take effect upon promulgation by Executive Order."

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Section 8. This Act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its approval.
