AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 15103 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE GUAM'S WASHINGTON HEFRESENTATIVE AN ALLOWANCE FOR TRANSPONTATION OF HIS HOUSEHOLD AND PERSONAL EFFECTS TO AND FROM WASHINGTON, D. C.

BE IT AMACTED BY THE PROPER OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 15103 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby
amended to read as follows:

"Section 15103. Seme: compensation and expenses. The Washington representative shall be paid an annual salary of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) and in addition thereto shall be allowed an annual budget for the purposes of providing round trip transportation from Guam to Washington, D. C., for himself and dependents once each year and to provide for necessary expenses of office rental and such clerical and technical assistance as he may deem in the public interest. In addition, the Washington representative shall be satisfied to an allowance to provide for transportation at government of Guam expense of his household and personal effects, including his automobile, from Guam to Office, for whatever cause, to transport such household and personal effects, including his automobile, back to Guam."
