AN ACT MAKING SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE  
EXECUTIVE, JUDICIAL AND LEGISLATIVE BRANCHES OF THE  
GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30,  
1968 AND FOR THE OPERATION OF THE OFFICE OF WASHINGTON  
REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31,  
1968, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated from any available  
funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to supplement prior  
appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1968, and for other purposes.

Section 2. Section 6113 is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 6113. Emergency Expenses. The Governor of Guam is authorized to utilize any part or portion, not to exceed the sum of \$250,000, of outstanding appropriations within the General Fund, for expenses caused by Civil Defense emergencies. Whenever this authorization is used by the Governor, he shall report the expenditures thereunder to the Legislature next convening."

Section 3. The Judicial Council, on behalf of the Judicial Branch of the government of Guam, may if it so wishes, increase by an additional step the present pay of the classified employees of such branch who were in Step "F" of the old pay range system at the effective date of Public Law 7-117, Seventh Guam Legislature.

Section 4. This Act is an urgency measure.
