AH ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (n) OF SECTION 23100, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, TO AUTHORIZE TEMPORARY MOTORCYCLE LICENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Subsection (n) of Section 23100, Government Gode of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(n) After passing an examination as required under Subsection (g) to include an actual demonstration of ability to exercise ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a motorcycle an applicant may have his operator's or chauffeur's permit endorsed by the Director of Public Safety, or his designee, authorizing the applicant to operate a motorcycle on the highways of Guam. The Director of Public Safety may in his discretion accept evidence of a military motorcycle permit in lieu of this examination and endorsement. No person shall operate a motorcycle on the highway without first complying with this section except that a person having in his immediate possession a valid motorcycle operator's license issued by any other territory or state of the United States, or by a foreign country, may operate a motorcycle upon the highways for a period not exceeding thirty days from the date such person arrived in Guam. Any person who operates a motorcycle in violation of this Title shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than six (6) months or by fine of not more than \$250.00, or both."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
