AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 324.1(b), 324.2 AND 324.3 OF THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM TO REQUIRE BINGO OPERATORS TO STATE THE USE FOR WHICH FUNDS OBTAINED FROM BINGO ARE TO BE PUT AND LIMITING THE NUMBER OF BINGO GAMES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Subsection (b) of Section 324.1 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) 'Authorized organization' shall mean and include only religious, charitable, fraternal and nonprofit organizations, associations or societies, organized and operated exclusively for the benefit of the community and for the promotion of social welfare, and each parish of any religious denomination of island-wide practice shall be deemed for the purpose of this chapter an individual 'authorized organization." Section 2. Section 324.2 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 324.2. Registration. Each applicant for registration as an authorized organization shall file with the Director of Finance a written application therefor in the form prescribed by the Director, duly executed and verified, in which shall be stated the name and address of the applicant, together with sufficient facts relating to its organization and operation to enable the Director to determine whether it is a bona fide authorized organization and entitled to registration, including the use to which all funds obtained from bingo are to be put. If the Director finds that the applicant is qualified under the provisions of this Chapter he shall register the same as an authorized organization. The application, and the Director's findings thereon and the registration roll of each applicant registered under the Bingo Law shall be public records available to the inspection of any member of the public at all reasonable hours." Section 3. Section 324.3 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 324.3. Conduct of bingo: proceeds. Bingo games may be conducted under this Chapter, subject to the following restrictions:

(a) No person, association, society or organization, other than an authorized organization registered pursuant to this Chapter, shall be permitted to conduct such games, except that no registration shall be required of any agency or instrumentality of the Armed Forces of the United States, or an organization under the sponsorship of the Armed Forces of the United States, to conduct bingo solely within military reservations.

(b) No person except a bona fide member of any such organization shall be permitted to participate in the management or operation of such game, nor shall any organization engage the services of any person or admit any person to membership for the purpose of promoting, operating or managing any such game.

(c) The entire net proceeds of any game shall be exclusively devoted to the intended use of the authorized organization as set forth in its application for authorization.

(d) No authorized organization may hold bingo games more often than once a week.

(e) A record shall be kept of all receipts and disbursements in connection with each game, and a monthly accounting thereof submitted to the Director of Finance, who is directed to examine such records to assure that all receipts and disbursements are in accord with the intended use of the authorized organization as set forth in its application for authorization.

(f) Upon completion of the project for which approval is given under the provisions of this chapter, the right of any authorized organization to conduct bingo games, other than an exclusively religious organization, shall cease and terminate, unless and until a new project is determined upon which meets the approval of the Governor, but in any event any such authorized organization desiring to use 'bingo' for a use other than that originally approved shall be required to re-register pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter." Section 4. This Act shall take effect July 1, 1968. Section 5. This Act is an urgency measure.

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
