AN ACT TO REPRAL AND REPRACT SECTION 573 OF THE CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM AUTHORIZING THE DEPOSIT OF COURT FURDS IN LOCAL BARKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PROPIE OF THE TENRITORY OF GUAN:

Section 1. Section 573 of the Code of Civil Procedure of the territory of Guama is hereby repealed and a new Section 573 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"Section 573. Clerk to Deposit Money Received.

Whenever money is paid into or deposited in court to be held in custody or trust for or on behalf of a person ether than the government of Guam, the same shall be delivered to the clerk of the court in person. He thereupon must deposit it with a licensed bank in Guam in a special trust account in the name of the Court which shall be drawn upon only on order of the court. All money received to which the government of Guam is entitled, such as fines, costs, filing fees, and the like shall be deposited with the treasurer of the government of Guam."

Section 2. This Act is an urgancy measure.
