AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 652 TO THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM AND TO AMEND SECTION 653 OF SAID CODE RELATING TO THE CRIME OF PUBLIC INTOXICATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 652 is hereby added to the Penal Code of Guam to read

"Section 652. Public Drunkenness. Every person who is under the influence of any intoxicating beverage in any public place, or upon any public highway, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$50 or by imprisonment for not more than 60 days, or by such both fine and imprisonment, unless such person is convicted as a common drunkard, in which case Section 647 of this Code shall apply."

Section 2. Section 653 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 653. Alcoholic beverages. Disposition, transport.

(1) Gift or other disposal: It shall be unlawful to give, or in any other way dispose of, intoxicating liquors upon which the internal revenue tax has not been paid into the treasury of the government of Guam. Anyone who violates this section shall be fined an amount equal to 100 times the amount of the tax involved.

(2) Transportation: It shall be unlawful to transport intoxicating liquors on which the prescribed taxes have not been paid. Anyone who shall so do shall be fined 100 times the amount of the unpaid taxes." Section 3. This Act is an urgency measure.
