

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 105, 106 AND 109
OF THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM TO INCREASE THE
PUNISHMENT FOR PRISON ESCAPE AND FOR AIDING
SUCH ESCAPE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 105 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby
amended to read as follows:

"Section 105. Escape of Prisoner. Every prisoner who
escapes or attempts to escape from the custody of the Director
of Public Safety or his authorized representative or from
any person having the lawful custody of such prisoner or from
any correctional institution or other place of confinement
or hospital in which he is confined by direction of the
Director of Public Safety, or from any custody under or by
virtue of any process issued under the laws of Guam by any
court or judge, or from the custody of any peace officer of
Guam or person pursuant to lawful arrest, is guilty of a
felony and is punishable by imprisonment not less than two
years nor more than ten years and by fine not exceeding
\$1,000."

Section 2. Section 106 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby
amended to read as follows:

"Section 106. Officers Aiding Escape. Any
warden, keeper of a prison, jail, or person employed as a
guard, watchman, or other person, or person, aide, convict, or
other person who aids or attempts to aid any prisoner in custody,
is guilty of a felony and is punishable by imprisonment not less
than two years nor more than ten years and by fine not exceeding

1 \$1,000. Every such person who negligently permits the escape
2 of any prisoner in custody, is guilty of a misdemeanor punish-
3 able by a fine not exceeding \$500."

4 Section 3. Section 109 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby
5 amended to read as follows:

6 "Section 109. Person assisting prisoners or insane
7 persons to escape. Any person who wilfully assists any
8 prisoner or insane person confined in any prison, jail or
9 public hospital or in the lawful custody to any officer or
10 person to escape, or in an attempt to escape therefrom, is
11 guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment not exceeding
12 18 months and by fine not exceeding \$1,000."

13 Section 4. The amendments made by this Act to the foregoing
14 Sections of the Penal Code shall not apply to offenses committed
15 prior to the effective date of this Act.

16 Section 5. This Act is an urgency measure.
