AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4106, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, ADD A NEW SECTION 5112 TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, ADD A NEW TITLE LVIII TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, REPEAL CHAPTER 9 OF TITLE IX, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, AMEND SECTIONS 8822 AND 8824, GOVERN-MENT CODE OF GUAM, REPEAL SECTIONS 274, 275, AND 276 OF THE CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE, AND AMEND SECTIONS 851, 875, 877, 1152, 1213, 1217, 1221, 1226, 1228, 1230, 1234.1, 1234.2, 1234.3 AND 1234.4 OF THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING A DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND TO AMEND SECTION 9130 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROHIBIT THE PUBLIC DEFENDER FROM TAKING ELECTIVE OFFICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 4106 of Chapter 2, Title V, Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended by adding an item to read as follows:

"Section 4106. Executive Branch.

Director of Corrections \$15,750"

Section 2. A new Section 5112 is hereby added to Chapter 2, Title VI, Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

"Section 5112. Department of Corrections. There is within the Executive Branch of the government of Guam a Department of Corrections. The Director of Corrections is the head of the Department of Corrections. The Director of Corrections is appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Legislature." Section 3. A new Title LVIII is hereby added to the

Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"TITLE LVIII

DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

Chapter 1

Administration

Section 55000. Title. This Act may be cited as the

Department of Corrections.

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Section 55001. Definitions. As used in this title:

- (a) 'Director' means the Director of Corrections.
- (b) 'Department' means the Department of

Corrections.

Section 55002. Purpose of Department. The Department shall protect the public from the destructive action of law offenders, both juvenile and adults, through control and rehabilitation. It shall provide staff services for the judiciary, the Parole Board, probation officials and interested agencies of the Executive Branch.

Section 55003. Adult Offenders. The Director shall establish and operate correctional institutions, and other places of confinement, for prisoners serving sentences of imprisonment imposed by the Courts of Guam and other authorized prisoners, persons charged with offenses, and other persons placed in the custody of the Director or held by him or arrested, pursuant to the laws of Guam.

Section 55004. Juvenile Detention. The Director shall establish and operate facilities for the temporary or continuing care, custody, detentions or commitment of children pursuant to the orders of the Juvenile Court under Title V of the Code of Civil Procedure.

Section 55005. Rules and Regulations. The Director subject to the approval of the Governor by Executive Order, is authorized to make rules and regulations for the administration of correctional institutions and other places of confinement, including, but not limited to, necessary disciplinary measures for inmates thereof and for their treatment, care, labor,

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rehabilitation and reformation.

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Section 55006. Corrections Advisory Council. There is hereby established the Corrections Advisory Council composed of the Chairman of the Governor's Committee on Children and Youth, the Chairman of the Territorial Parole Board, the Judge of the Juvenile Court, the Administrator of Social Services or his representative, the Principal of the Trade and Technical School or his representative, the United States Attorney or his representative and, in addition, one representative from the business community and one member from the general public, who shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature. The Director of the Department shall be ex officic secretary of the Council and the Department shall furnish necessary logistic support. The Council shall advise the Director and the Department as to the policies and procedures to carry out the intent and purposes of this title.

Section 55007. Transfer of Functions. The Department does hereby assume all the powers, duties and responsibilities of the Department of Public Safety for the confinement of prisoners. The Department also does hereby assume all the powers, duties and responsibilities of the Department of Public Health and Social Services for the operation of the Juvenile Detention Home.

Section 55008. References. Whenever the Department of Public Safety or the Department of Public Health and Social Services is referred to by law, contract, Executive Order, rule or regulation or document concerning a function transferred by Section 55007 such reference shall be deemed to mean the Department of Corrections. All references to the Director of Public Safety or the Director of Public Health and Social Services in law, contract, rule or regulation, Executive Order or document concerning a function transferred by Section 55007 shall be deemed to mean the Director of Corrections.

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Section 55009. Organization and Personnal.

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(a) The Director may establish such divisions or other organizational units as he may determine to be necessary for the efficient and effective administration and operation of the Department. Each such division or organizational unit shall be subject to the supervision and direction of the Director and shall have jurisdiction of such matters, exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be assigned to it by the Director or otherwise by applicable laws.

(b) The Director may appoint and rename officers and other employees within the Department in accordance with the provisions of the Personnel and Compensation Law, Title V, Government Code of Guam.

(c) The Director may delegate authority for the performance of any of his powers or duties to any officer or employee under his direction and supervision.

Section 55010. General Powers and Duties of Director: As head of the Department, the Director:

(a) Shall administer the Department.
(b) Shall exercise and discharge the powers and duties of the Department through such divisions, or other organizational units as he may establish pursuant to this Title or as otherwise provided by law.

(c) May formulate and adopt rules necessary or proper for the internal administration of the Department, subject to the approval of the Governor.

Section 55011. Transfer of records, equipment and facilities. Upon the transfer of functions as provided in this Act all contracts, books, records, papers, maps, plans, documents, facilities and pending business heretofore made, used and acquired or conducted by the Departments of Public Safety and Public Health and Social Services in the exercise of the

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functions transferred shall be transferred to the Department of Corrections.

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Section 55012. Transfer of officers and employees. All officers and employees of the Department of Public Safety and Public Health and Social Services covered herein, upon the transfer of functions, shall be transferred to the Department of Corrections.

Section 55013. Effective date. This Act shall take effect upon its passage and approval, but in order that there be no interruption of the administrative business of the government, the Governor may, for a period not to exceed six months, postpone the actual transfer of all or a portion of the functions herein considered until such time as the organization herein provided for can be put in full force and effect. Except as otherwise provided all officers, their subordinates and employees whose functions are covered by this Act, shall continue to perform the same from the time this Act takes effect in like manner as though they had been appointed or employed after the passage of this Act until successors to said functions and duties are appointed and qualified."

Section 4. All unexpended appropriations heretofore made for the operation of the Departments of Public Safety and Public Health and Social Services for the functions herein considered are transferred to the Department of Corrections as this Act is implemented by the Governor.

Section 5. Chapter 9 of Title IX, Government Code of Guam, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 6. Section 8822, Chapter 9.1 of Title IX, Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

30 "Section 8822. Authority of Director of Corrections.
31 The Director of Corrections may commit or transfer any inmate
32 of a penal institution under his responsibility to any

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1 institution without Guam if the territory of Guam has entered into a contract or contracts for the confinement of inmates 2 3 in such institution pursuant to Article III of the compact." 4 Section 7. Section 8824, Chapter 9.1 of Title IX, Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows: 5 "Section 8824. Hearings. The Director of Corrections 6 7 is hereby authorized and directed to hold such hearings as may 8 be requested by any party state pursuant to Article IV(f) of 9 the compact." 10 Section 8. Sections 274, 275 and 276 all of Chapter 1, 11 Title V, Code of Civil Procedure, are hereby repealed in their 12 entirety. 13 Section 9. Section 851, Chapter V of Title III, Part 14 II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 851. Peace Officers. The following are 15 16 peace officers: 17 (a) All other magistrates. 18 (b) All commissioners. 19 (c) All deputy commissioners. 20 (d) All members of the police force. 21 (e) All officers of the Department of Corrections." 22 Section 10. Section 875, Chapter VII of Title III, Part 23 II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 875. Order for bail on commitment. If the 24 offense is bailable, and the defendant is admitted to bail, the 24 25 following words must be added to the order, 'And that he be admitted to bail in the sum of _____ dollars, and is 26 27 committed to the Director of Corrections until he gives such bail'." 28 Section 11. Section 877, Chapter VII of Title III, Part 29 30 II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows: 31 "Section 877. Form of commitment. The commitment must be to the following effect: 32 The Territory of Guam to the Director of 33 Corrections: 34 - 6 -

An order having been this day made by me, that A. B. be held to answer upon a charge of (stating briefly the nature of the offense, and giving as near as may be the time when and the place where the same was committed), you are commanded to receive him into your custody and detain him until he is legally discharged.

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Dated this _____ day of _____ 19___." Section 12. Section 1152, Chapter II, Title VI, Part II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1152. Proceedings upon conviction. If the court finds the defendant guilty, he must be remanded, if in custody, or if on bail he may be committed to the Director of Corrections to await the judgment of the court upon the finding. When committed his bail is exonerated or if money is deposited instead of bail, it must be refunded to the defendant."

Section 13. Section 1213, Chapter V, Title VII, Part II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1213. Authority for the execution of a judgment other than death. When a judgment other than death has been pronounced, a copy of entry thereof upon the minutes, certified to by the judge and clerk of the court, must be forthwith furnished to the Director of Corrections whose duty it is to execute the judgment, and no other warrant or authority is necessary to justify or require its execution. When an appeal is taken, Section 1243 of this code shall govern."

Section 14. Section 1217, Chapter V, Title VII, Part II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1217. Warrant of death. When a judgment of death is rendered, and the judgment has become final, a warrant signed by the judge and attested by the clerk, under the seal of the court, must be drawn and delivered to the Director of

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Corrections. The warrant must state the conviction, and judg-]____ ment, and must appoint a day on which the judgment is to be executed, which must be not less than 20 nor more than 60 days from the time of final judgment. The warrant shall direct the Director of Corrections to execute the death penalty between the hours of 6 o'clock in the morning and 6'o'clock in the evening of the day appointed. The warrant shall further direct the place of execution of the death penalty which shall ordinarily be in or adjacent to the prison of the district in which the crime was committed, but the court in its discretion may fix the place of execution at any other place within Guam when there are special reasons therefor. The penalty of death shall not be executed on a legal holiday."

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Section 15. Section 1221, Chapter V, Title VII, Part II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1221. Insanity of defendant, how determined. If, after the final judgment of a sentence of death and at any time prior to the execution of the death penalty, there is good reason to believe that a defendant, under judgment of death, has become insane, the Director of Corrections must call such fact to the attention of the Island Attorney, Attorney General and to the judge of the court having jurisdiction, and ask that the question of his sanity be inquired into."

Section 16. Section 1226, Chapter V, Title VII, Part II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1226. If female is pregnant. Duty of the Court. If it is found that the female is pregnant, the court shall by proper orders suspend the execution of the sentence until 40 days after she has been delivered, when the court shall appoint a new day for the execution of the sentence. If it is found that the female is not pregnant the court shall by proper orders direct the Director of Corrections to execute

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the judgment."

Section 17. Section 1228, Chapter V, Title VII, Part 3 II, Panal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 1228. Death penalty, who shall be present. 4 5 The Director of Corrections, the Attorney General, and the Director of Medical Services must be present at the execution. 6 The Director of Corrections of Guam shall, at the request of the 7 defendant permit such ministers of the Gospel, not exceeding 8 9 two, as the defendant may name, and any persons, relatives, or friends, not to exceed five; to be present at the execution. 10 11 The Director of Corrections shall require such peace officers 12 as he may think expedient, to be present at the execution." Section 18. Section 1230, Chapter V, Title VII, Part 13

II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1230. Return of the Director of Corrections. After the execution the Director of Corrections must make a return of the death warrant to the court by which the judgment was rendered, showing the time, mode, and manner in which it was executed."

Section 19. Section 1234.1, Chapter IV, Title VII, Part II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1234.1. Extension of Limits of Confinement. The Director of Corrections may extend the limits of the place of confinement of a prisoner entrusted to his custody as to whom there is reasonable cause to believe he will honor his trust, by authorizing him, under prescribed conditions, to visit a specifically designated place or places for a period not to extend twenty-four hours and return to the institution. An extension of limits may be granted only, to permit a visit to a dying relative, attendance at the funeral of a relative, the obtaining of medical services not otherwise available, or for any other compelling reason consistent with the public interest.

Section 20. Section 1234.2, Chapter IV, Title VII, Part II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

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"Section 1234.2. Same: Work Furlough. The Director of Corrections may also extend the limits of confinement of such a prisoner as is described in Section 1234.1 by authorizing him, under prescribed conditions, to visit a specifically designated place or places for a period not to exceed nine hours and return to the same. An extension of limits, under this section may be granted only to permit the extension or continuance of a prisoner's education, to contact a prospective employer, to work at paid employment while continuing as a prisoner of the Guam Penitentiary; provided, that:

> (a) Representatives of local union or similar labor union organizations are consulted;

(b) Such paid employment will not result in the displacement of employed workers, or be applied in skills, crafts, or trades in which there is a surplus of available gainful labor in the territory, or impair existing contracts for services; and

(c) The rates of pay and other conditions of employment will not be less than those paid or provided for work of similar nature in the territory." Section 21. Section 1234.3, Chapter IV, Title VII, Part II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1234.3. Repayment of Costs of Confinement. A prisoner authorized to work at paid employment in the territory under Section 1234.2 may be required to pay, and the Director of Corrections is authorized to collect, such costs incident to the prisoner's confinement as the Director of Corrections deems

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appropriate and reasonable. Collections shall be deposited in the General Fund of the Treasury of Guam."

Section 22. Section 1234.4, Chapter IV, Title VII, Part II, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1234.4. Failure to Conform: Punishment. The wilful failure of a prisoner to remain within the extended limits of his confinement, as authorized by the provisions of this Chapter, or to return within the time prescribed to the institution shall be deemed as escape from the custody of the Director of Corrections punishable under Section 105 of this Code."

Section 23. Section 9130 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 9130. Public Defender. There is hereby established within the Division of Public Welfare in the Department of Public Health and Welfare, the office of the Public Defender of Guam, which shall be filled by an attorney, duly admitted and licensed to practice before the District Court of Guam, who shall be appointed by the Governor and who shall be a member of the Classified Service of the government of Guam with pay range 35. For purposes of performing his official duties, the Public Defender may practice before the courts of Guam on the same basis as other government attorneys under Section 28002.2, Government Code of Guam. No Public Defender shall be eligible to any local elective office within two (2) years of his relinquishment of the office of Public Defender."

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
