Introduced by

Committee on Rules, by request of the Governor in accordance with Section 6(b) of the Organic Act of Guam.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 9950.2(d), 9950.2(e), AND 9950.4 OF, AND TO ADD A NEW SECTION 9950.7(c) TO, CHAPTER 11, TITLE X, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO WATER POLLUTION CONTROL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 9950.2(d) of Chapter 11, Title X, Government Code of Guem, is smended to read as follows:

"Section 9950.2(d) 'Contamination' means an impairment of the qualities of the waters of the territory by sewage, industrial wastes, or other wastes to a degree which creates a hazard to human health or is detrimental to the most beneficial uses of the waters."

Section 2. Section 9950.2(e) of Chapter 11, Title X, Government Code of Guam, is amended to read as follows:

"Section 9950.2(e) 'Pollution' as used in this Act shall mean the alteration of the physical, chemical or biological properties of any waters of the territory which adversely and unreasonably impair the water quality of the territory or which renders said waters hazardous to human health or hamful or detrimental for their most beneficial uses."

Section 3. Section 9950.4 of Chapter 11, Title X, Government Code of Guen, is hereby emended to read as follows:

"Section 9950.4. Commission. There is hereby created a Water Pollution Control Commission, hercinafter referred to as the 'Commission.' The Commission shall consist of five (5) members as follows: The Director of Public Health and Welfare; Director of Agriculture; Chief Officer of Public Utility Agency of Guem; and two (2) members to be appointed by the Governor.

The Chairman shall be elected from emong their number. Members of the Galamissian shall serve for terms of two (2) years each or the terms of their office as may be the case.

Members of the Commission shall serve without compensation, as such, but shall be reimbursed for reasonable travel and out-of -pocket expenses incurred in the performance of Commission duties. The Department of Public Health and Welfare shall furnish all logistic support for the Commission.

The Cornission shall hold at least two (2) regular meetings each calendar year and shall keep a record of its proceedings which shall be open to the public for inspection. Special meetings may be called by the Chairman. Written notice of the time and place for all meetings shall be given to each member of the Commission.

Each member of the Commission may, by order filed with the Secretary of the Commission, designate a deputy or alternate to perform the duties of the member making the designation. Such persons, if any, designated pursuant to this section, shall have the powers and be subject to the duties and responsibilities of the member designating him.

The Secretary of the Commission shall be designated by the Director, and shall keep all records of meetings of, and actions taken by, the Commission."

Section 4. A new Section 9950.7(c) is hereby added to Chapter 11, Title X, Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

"Section 9950.7(c) No permit shall be issued under this Section for any use in violation of Water Quality Standards adopted under this Act."

Section 5. This Act is an urgency measure.
