AN ACT ADDING A NEW SUBCHAPTER 7a TO TITLE 12, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, TO AUTHORIZE THE GUAM TRADE AND TECHNICAL SCHOOL TO INSTITUTE ADVANCED TRAINING COURSES IN THE SCARCE SKILLS CURRENTLY IN DEMAND AND UNAVAILABLE LOCALLY.

WHEREAS, events all around us are evidence that we are living in a fast changing world; and

WHEREAS, the recent developments in communications, atomic science, medicine and agriculture are dramatic reminders of the marvels of our age; and

WHEREAS, as a result of these advances, almost every corner of the earth is experiencing what has been termed the revolution of rising expectations; and

WHEREAS, people everywhere are seeking, hoping and striving for sweeping alterations in their daily lives to cope with the conditions that prevent the enrichment of their lives; and

WHEREAS, these scientific advances have thus resulted in the quest by mankind for the social transformations needed to equip the world's workers with the skills to be proficient in the new, scientific environment; and

WHEREAS, the people of Guam have begun to realize the serious effects these modern developments and advances have had in the traditional island way of life; and

WHEREAS, in recent years an approach was made to solve this problem of gaining proficiency in modern skills by the establishment of a Trade and Technical School within the Department of Education, which school is now in dire need of expansion; and WHEREAS, the obsolute necessity of enlarging this facility is pointed up by the rapid and expanded utilization of electrical and electrohic equipment by both Federal and local governments, and by local industries, and businesses, which has resulted in the demand for increasing numbers of trained technicians; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature is aware that the clamor for trained personnel in these fields will continue to increase; and

WHEREAS, the great strides in medicine and public health which cut down infant mortality and prolong life expectancy have resulted in the spectacular growth of population in the territory; and

WHEREAS, with the rapid growth of all other sectors of life, it is more urgent than ever for each to recognize that the real answer lies in more effective technical education; and

WHEREAS, the following legislation will greatly enhance the preparation and readiness of our citizens of all ages, but more particularly will benefit the present high school students by making them technically and professionally equipped with the fundamentals needed in the varied but related fields of electrical engineering and electronics which are presently, and in future years, will remain, in great demand by the community; and

WHEREAS, due to lack of local people possessing such skills, a large number of off-island personnel must be recruited to perform this essential work within Guam, and, as the demand increases, more will have to be brought to Guam unless and until our local residents, with proper instructions, can fill this need, to the benefit of both the individuals so trained and of the territory; now therefore

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The following new Subchapter 7a is hereby added to Title XII of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Chapter 7a

Electronics Training

Section 11650. Statement of Findings. The Legislature finds that there is at the present time a large and constantly increasing demand for

craftsmen in the various phases of the electronic industry and related fields, and that these skills are in a field of endeavor for which, with present advances in technology, the demand will continue to increase in the future, that there is a great and growing number of opportunities in electronic fields and related fields in Guam not only with agencies of the Federal government but in commercial radar, communications and other related fields, that at the present time this advanced training is not available to residents of Guam but can be provided through the present organization of the Guam Trade and Technical School, that there are commercial systems to teach and train these skills that are provided by several of the larger and more technically advanced corporations in the United States, and that utilizing these systems offers the best available solution to the need for the provision of technicians skilled in electronics and related matters.

Section 11651. Authorization. The Department of Education, with the approval of the Governor, is authorized to contract with a responsible corporation to provide a technical training program in electronics and related fields in the Trade and Technical School, such contract to include the provision by the contractor of all materials, supplies, teaching aids and literature needed. Such contract shall be designed to produce a course in electronics to train local persons in the needed skills and at the same time to train local instructors to carry on such course.

Section 11652. Course to be self-sustaining. Any contract authorized by the provisions of this Chapter shall require the training of local residents to continue teaching such a course on a self-sustaining basis after the initial contract period, which period shall not be in excess of three years.

Section 11653. Survey. The Trade and Technical School shall conduct a survey as to the desirability and practicality of similar courses to be provided by outside contractors in the automotive and internal combustion engine fields, in the repair and maintenance of household and commercial appliances, including radios and television, in mechanical,

architectural, electronic and aeronautical drafting, in the construction trades and in the various other skills and report the results thereof to the Governor for transmission to the Legislature with appropriate recommendations as to the institution of such courses in those fields."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
