AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 2313 AND 2315 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAN RAISING THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF ELECTION EXPENSES FROM \$100 PER NOMINEE TO \$1,000.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 2313 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2313. Same: incidental expenses. As a part of lawful expenses, independent nominees, committees, and political parties may expend money for necessary incidental expenses, which, plus traveling expenses do not exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per nominee."

Section 2. Section 2315 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2315. Maximum amount of expense. No sum may be paid and no expense may be incurred, directly or indirectly, by or on behalf of a nominee, whether before, during or after an election at which he is a candidate, in excess of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00)."

Section 3. This Act is an urgency measure.
