## NINTH GUAM LIGHTLE TOTE 1960 (SECOND) Regular Session

Bill No. 405

Introduced by G. M. Bamba O. L. Delfin

AN ACT TO AMEND THE TITLE OF SUBCHAPTERS A AND B OF CHAPTER 9, TITLE XII OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, TO AMEND THE TITLE OF CHAPTER 10 OF SAID TITLE AND SECTIONS 11800, 11803, 11813, 11830, 11838, 11840, 11841, 11875, 11876, AND 11877 OF SAID GOVERNMENT CODE, TO CHANGE THE COLLEGE OF GUAM TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The Title of Subchapters A and P of Chapter 9, Title XII of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended, respectively, to read as follows:

### "SUBCHAPTER A

Scholarships to the University of Guam" "SUBCHAPTER B

Graduates of the University of Guam"

Section 2. The Title of Chapter 10 of Title XII of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### "CHAPTER 10

#### University of Guam"

Section 3. Section 11800 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11800. Students entitled to scholarship: amount of scholarship. There are hereby established annual scholarships to the University of Guam, to include textbooks, waiver of tuition and other fees for a period of not more than four years. Recipients of such scholarships shall be selected from the high school students in each graduating class of the several public

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established, who have completed four years of high school, of which at least the last year shall have been in Guam, and who are among the highest 20% of their class in scholastic standing. Each graduating class of said schools is entitled to one such scholarship as herein provided, and in addition for every twenty-five (25) graduates, or fraction thereof, an additional scholarship is provided. Each school shall make the selection based on scholarship, aptitude, interest, health, personality, ambition, and other criteria in accordance with regulations of the Board." Section 4. Section 11803 of the Covernment Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11803. Students entitled to scholarship: amount of scholarship. In order to encourage attendance of high school graduates at the University of Guam, and to recognize superior scholarship and to encourage the development of other outstanding qualities, two university students in each annual graduating class of the University of Guam are hereby provided scholarships in an amount which shall reasonably cover the cost of room and board, books, tuition and other university fees, as annually determined by the Board, in an accredited institution within the United States or its territories and which has been approved by the Faculty of the University of Guam, for a period of two years next succeeding the year of graduation. Any student hereunder shall be entitled a grant to cover the cost of initial transportation to the institution and thereafter he shall be entitled to the travel and

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of this Code upon the completion of his studies.

Students shall be selected on the basis of scholarship, aptitude, interest, health, personality, ambition and other criteria consistent with the purposes of this subchapter. To be eligible for consideration for the scholarship a student must be a United States citizen and must have established his residence in Guam for a period of at least two years immediately preceding his application, and must have a cumulative grade-point average of 'B' or better upon graduation from the University of Guam. Selection shall be made by the Faculty of the University or a Committee thereof."

Section 5. Section 11813 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11813. Student loans. The Board is authorized to approve loans to qualified applicants for advanced education beyond the high school level which may be in an amount sufficient to reasonably cover all or any part of the cost of transportation, room and board, tuition and other required fees for a period of one academic year in an accredited college, university, or technical or trade school in the United States or its territories, provided that loans to students of the University of Guam shall not exceed Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars a year, and to students in institutions outside of Guam, the amount shall not exceed Fifteen Hundred Dollars a year and in no case shall the total amount loaned exceed Six Thousand Dollars. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any full-time student, on regular status and having a grade average

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at time of application of not less than 'C', in 1 financial need, and a bona fide resident of Guam, attending an accredited college, university or technical school in the United States or its territories, is 1 5 deemed to be otherwise qualified to obtain a loan 6 hereunder." 7 Section 6. Section 11830 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 11830. Designation of university. The 9 university founded and established by the government of 10 Guam heretofore designated as the Territorial College of 11 12 Guam shall be known and designated as the University of 13 Guam, hereinafter referred to as the University." Section 7. Section 11838 of the Government Code of Guam 14 is hereby amended to read as follows: 1.5 16 "Section 11838. 'Nonresident student' defined. 'Nonresident student' means any person who has not been 1.7 18 a bona fide resident of the territory of Guam for more 19

'Nonresident student' means any person who has not been a bona fide resident of the territory of Guam for more than one year immediately preceding the opening day of a semester during which he proposes to attend the University. Every alien student who has not made a valid declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States, as provided by law, prior to the opening day of a semester during which he proposes to attend the University, is deemed to be a nonresident student."

Section 8. Section 11840 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11840. Facilities and personnel. (a) All property, facilities, equipment, supplies, records and files exclusively pertaining to or exclusively issued

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in commercian with the operation or administration of the University of Guam in the Department of Education are hereby transferred to the University of Guam;

(b) All personnel in the Department of Education who are presently exclusively employed in the operation or administration of the University of Guam are hereby transferred to the University of Guam."

Section 9. Section 11841 of the Government Code of Guzm is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11841. University auxiliary services fund. (a) For the purpose of securing, insofar as possible, self-supporting operation of the University of Guam Book Store, University of Guam Food Services and other auxiliary services of the University, there is hereby established a fund to be known as the 'University Auxiliary Services Fund' which shall be maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam, and independent records and accounts shall be maintained in connection therewith.

(b) All monies received by the University of Cuam from its auxiliary services shall be deposited in said University Auxiliary Services Fund. All debts, liabilities and obligations of any such services shall be paid from said fund. The President of the University of Guam shall render monthly to the Board of Regents a statement reflecting the financial condition of the University Auxiliary Services Fund. The Director of Finance shall periodically examine the accounts and records of the University Auxiliary Services Fund and render the reports required by law."

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Section 10. Section 11875 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

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"Section 11875. Findings and purpose. The Legislature finds, that the rapid increase in the numbers of
school age children in Guam and the need for employment
of additional teachers each school year results in an
ever increasing financial burden upon the government of
Guam in meeting its obligation to maintain a modern
system of public education; that the problem is made
more acute by an increasing shortage of adequately
trained local teachers with the result that it has
become necessary to recruit such teachers from offisland; and that the government has thus far failed in
its efforts to induce adequate numbers of local students
to seek a career in public education.

Pursuant to these findings the Legislature therefore declares that it is the purpose of this Chapter to provide for an accelerated program for the training of local teachers in the University of Guam, and to thereby minimize the necessity for additional off-island recruitment."

Section 11. Section 11876 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11876. Program. (a) There is hereby established in the University of Guam a program for the selection of teacher-trainees to carry on a four (4) year course of study including attendance during both regular semesters and summer sessions, leading to a Bachelor of Arts degree in Education.

(b) Unmarried Trainees shall receive a monthly allowance in the amount of Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75)

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during the first year, One Hundred Dollars (\$100) during the second year, One Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars (\$125) during the third year, and One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150) during the fourth year of the program. Married trainees shall receive a monthly allowance of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) during the first year, One Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars (\$125) during the second year, One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150) during the third year, and One Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$175) during the fourth year of the program. Registration, tuition and other fees normally assessed shall not be charged, and a credit allowance in an amount not to exceed Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75) shall be allowed for each six months to cover the cost of textbooks and supplies."

Section 12. Section 11877 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11877. Selection of trainees. (a) Applicants for enrollment in the program shall be recommended to the Board of Regents by the principal of each of the public or private high schools in Guam, in accordance with regulations adopted by the Board, which shall establish criteria for selection, including scholarships, aptitude for and interest in a teaching career.

- (b) Selection for admission to the program shall be made by the Board on the basis of the recommendation by the school principal, results of aptitude tests administered by the University, and such other criteria as the Board may establish.
- (c) The program shall be open to any student who has completed high school and who is a United States citizen and a resident of Guam. The number of trainees

who may enroll in the program annually shall be limited only by the capacity of the University of Guam and by funds made available to it by annual appropriation."

Section 13. From and after the effective date of this Act all references to the College of Guam in the laws of Guam, and in rules, regulation and executive orders are hereby amended and are deemed to refer to the University of Guam.
