AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE
OPERATION OF THE EXECUTIVE, JUDICIAL,
AND LEGISLATIVE BRANCHES OF THE GOVERN-
MENT OF GUAM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING
JUNE 30, 1969, FOR THE OPERATION OF THE
OFFICE OF WASHINGTON REPRESENTATIVE FOR
THE CALENDAR YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31,
1969, MAKING A REAPPROPRIATION OF CER-
TAIN CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUNDS, AND
FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) for the Office of the Washington Representative for the calendar year ending December 31, 1969.

Section 3. Any grant received from the United States Government as General Fund revenue, is authorized to be expended for the purpose or purposes for which the grant is made.

Section 4. The budget analysis of this Act (as amended by the Committee of the Whole), prepared by the Committee on Finance and Taxation of the Legislature, is attached to this Act and is incorporated herein by reference as a recital preceding the enactment clause for the purpose of assisting in the interpretation and implementation of this Act.

Section 5. Effective June 30, 1968, the sum of \$2,000,000, consisting of unencumbered balances of funds appropriated for the purposes indicated and identified by the following appropriation allotment account numbers, is hereby returned to the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund:

18 in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund in the
19 amounts and for the purposes indicated and identified by
20 the appropriation allotment account numbers set out in
21 Section 5 hereof.

22 Section 7. Appropriations made by Section 6 of this
23 Act shall be available for all expenses incident to the
24 purposes for which made. Every appropriation made in
25 Section 6 shall continue in full force and effect until
26 expended for the project for which made or until the project
27 is completed.
