AN ACT TO ADD SUBCHAPTER J TO CHAPTER 9, TITLE XII,
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, TO GIVE INTERNSHIP TRAINING
WITH FELLOWSHIP BENEFITS TO QUALIFYING STUDENTS IN
COUNSELOR EDUCATION AND EDUCATION ADMINISTRATION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Subchapter J is hereby added to Chapter 9 of Title XII
3 of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

4 "Subchapter J

5 Government of Guam Fellowships in Counseling and Educational
6 Administration.

7 Section 11827. College of Guam Fellowships in Counselor
8 Education and Educational Administration. The Legislature finds that
9 the critical shortage of trained persons in counseling, guidance and
10 school administration areas has proved to be a severe handicap to the
11 schools and community agencies of Guam. In order to encourage local
12 residents to develop these skills, there are hereby established ten
13 annual fellowships for persons, hereinafter called "fellows" who are
14 United States citizens, and bona fide residents of Guam and either
15 qualify for acceptance as candidates for the Master of Arts degree
16 in Counselor Education or in Educational Administration at the
17 College of Guam, or possess a baccalaureate degree and are currently
18 enrolled in courses specified by the Board as prerequisite to the
19 Counselor Education or Educational Administration degree programs.
20 The Board is authorized to award such fellowships to those
21 applicants whom it considers most likely to become permanent
22 counselors or administrators within the public school system. Each

1 fellow shall be entitled to a monthly stipend of \$300 if single,
2 and \$350 if married, free tuition and textbooks.

3 Section 11828. Internship Training Program. The College of
4 Guam is hereby directed to conduct an internship training program
5 designed to provide fellows with the widest possible range of
6 experience. Fellows shall be enrolled in courses prescribed by the
7 Board, and shall also be employed as interns in the College of Guam
8 or other government agency for periods prescribed by the Board.
9 The program shall lead to the Master of Arts degree in Counselor
10 Education or Educational Administration and shall include all
11 academic work therefor required.

12 Section 11829. Forfeiture of Fellowship Benefits. Expulsion
13 from the College, suspension for a period of sixteen or more weeks,
14 failure to make satisfactory grades in all academic work undertaken
15 shall constitute forfeiture of the fellowship herein provided to its
16 recipient."
