AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE UP TO SEVENTY THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$72,500) FROM THE FISCAL YEAR 2017 GENERAL FUND REVENUES FOR **GUAM'S MEMBERSHIP INTO** THE WESTERN INSTERSTATE COMMISSION FOR HIGHER EDUCATION RELATIVE **PROVIDING AFFORDABLE** (WICHE) TO **TUITION** RATES **FOR GUAM'S UNDERGRADUATE** STUDENTS AT OVER 150 INSTITUTIONS WHO ARE PART OF THE WICHE NETWORK.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that for six decades the Western Interstate for Higher Education (WICHE) is a 3 regional non-profit organization created by the Western Regional Education Compact 4 to facilitate resource sharing among the higher education systems of western states and to increase accessibility of educational opportunities for students living in 6 WICHE member states and territories. Guam has the opportunity to join New 7 Mexico, Montana, Arizona, Utah, Oregon, Colorado, Wyoming, Idaho, Alaska, 8 Washington, California, Nevada, Hawaii, North Dakota, South Dakota and the CNMI, most of whom have been members since the 1950s, to further these 10 endeavors. Under the Compact, each state commits to support WICHE's operation 11 through annual dues established by the Commission. Member states will be able to 12 benefit by providing undergraduate student residents access to the Western 13

Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) Program. The WUE Program provides a reduced 1 tuition at no more than 150% of the resident tuition rate at over 150 participating two 2 and four year public institutions to all residents of member states. The normal tuition 3 rates for out of state residents of these institutions are at least double or more the 4 resident tuition rates. Graduate students are eligible for resident tuition for numerous 5 educational programs through the WICHE consortium. As a member, our 6 community will have access to following Student Exchange Programs: the Western 7 Undergraduate Exchange (WUE), the Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP), 8 the Professional Student Exchange (PSEP) and WICHE Internet Course Exchange 9 (WICHE ICE). 10

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that WICHE has already undergone the process for approval and has approved membership for the Pacific Island Territories and the Freely Associated State governments. The Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas (CNMI) government is the only island government to join under the Pacific Island Territories and has essentially paved the way for other territories such as Guam to gain approval and membership into WICHE. The annual dues for membership for all Pacific Island Territories and FSM governments is \$145,000, which can be divided proportionately by governments as they join. As the only government to join as a Pacific Island Territory, the CNMI pays an annual due of \$145,000. In its first year, the CNMI savings for 19 students was \$165,000. With Guam's potential membership into WICHE, the annual dues will be split with the CNMI, thereby requiring the government of Guam to annually commit no more than \$72,500.00. It is estimated that Guam will potentially have more than the 19 students the CNMI has enrolled and therefore the savings to Guam students will outweigh the investment of Guam's annual dues. Moreover, for an additional of \$15,000 per member (split proportionally), Guam will be eligible to the benefits under the

WICHE Mental Health Program whose mission is 1) to assist members in improving systems of care for mental health consumers and their families, and 2) to advance the preparation of a qualified mental health workforce in the West. Guam has benefitted from WICHE training to support objectives for federal system improvement grants and training in suicide prevention and Mental Health First Aid as well as consultation on accreditation options for inpatient/residential treatment in the past. Membership will permit our community to access WICHE's technical assistance and consultation services under its Mental Health Program.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the 32nd Guam Legislature passed on February 1, 2014 Resolution 234-32 (COR) relative to supporting Guam's application for membership in the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education. The unanimously adopted Resolution 234-32 (COR) resolved the people of Guam's support to become active members of WICHE and further urged the government of Guam to work with WICHE to cement Guam's status as a WICHE member.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to enter Guam into the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education, beginning in school year 2016 - 2017 in order to provide the opportunity for Guam's students to enroll in two and four year programs by paying no more than 150% of resident tuition rates at participating WICHE institutions, providing resident rate tuition for multiple graduate programs and providing access under all of the Student Exchange Programs (WUE, WRGP, PSEP and WICHE ICE) provided to members under WICHE.

It is further the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to join with the CNMI government in order to split the approximately \$145,000 annual dues and to welcome other Pacific Island Territories and Freely Associated State governments to participate in subsequent school years.

Guam's Membership into WICHE. The Director of the Department of Administration shall submit necessary documents, no later than June 15, 2016 Guam's to join the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education for beginning school year 2016-2017 as a co-member with the government of the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Island. Guam's membership shall continue on an annual basis and its proportionate share be adjusted downward with the eventual inclusion of other government's from the Pacific Island Territories and the Freely Associated States.

Section 3. Appropriation. The sum not to exceed Seventy Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$72,500) is hereby appropriated from the Fiscal Year 2017 General Fund revenues to the Department of Administration to fund Guam's proportionate share of its annual dues to the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education for school year 2016-2017. Payment to WICHE *shall* be made no later than December 31, 2016 for Guam's first year membership. The Department of Administration shall, beginning in Fiscal Year 2018 submit as a separate line item on its annual budget request the funds necessary to continue Guam's membership into WICHE.

Section 4. Statistics Report. The Director of the Department of Administration *shall* formulate a report that provides statistics on the number of Guam students who have enrolled in participating WICHE institutions and the amount of savings each student has saved as a result of the reduced tuition rate. The Statistics Report shall be transmitted to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* on an annual basis.

Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without
