AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 8107 AND 8108 OF CHAPTER 8, TITLE 7 GCA, §5103(d) OF CHAPTER 5, TITLE 17 GCA, AND § 6403 OF ARTICLE 4, CHAPTER 6, TITLE 17 GCA, AND BY ADDING A NEW §55102(h) OF CHAPTER 55, TITLE 10 GCA, RELATIVE TO PROPERLY CLASSIFY LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM BY RENAMING "ATTENDANCE **OFFICERS**" AS "TRUANCY OFFICERS" TO REFLECT PRACTICE THROUGHOUT UNITED STATES AND **CLASSIFY** OFFICERS AS LAW ENFORCEMENT UNDER THE 29-105; AND PROVISIONS OF PUBLIC LAW TO PROVIDE **UNIFORMS** AND **EQUIPMENT** TO TRUANCY OFFICERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that Public Law 14-55 first authorized the appointment of Attendance Officers.
- 4 Attendance Officers are authorized to "take into custody during school hours,
- 5 without warrant, any truant found away from the truant's home and who has
- 6 been reported truant." Attendance Officers are appointed by the Unified Judiciary
- 7 of Guam as Special Deputy Marshals under §8107(a) of Chapter 8, Title 7, Guam
- 8 Code Annotated. Under that same subsection, they are provided law enforcement
- 9 training under the Unified Judiciary of Guam.

The Attendance Officers are employed to enforce Guam's laws on truancy, but are not treated as law enforcement under Public Law 29-105.

It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* that Attendance Officers be renamed "Truancy Officers" to reflect the practice throughout the United States and to include them under the public safety and law enforcement pay adjustment if they are appointed as special deputy marshals of the court under Public Law 29-105, by amending §§ 8107 and 8108 of Chapter 8, Title 7, and Subsection (d) of §5103, Chapter 5, and § 6403, of Article 4 Chapter 6, Title 17, all of the Guam Code Annotated, and by adding a new (h) to §55102 of Chapter 55, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated.

Section 2. Marshal; Appointment of Special Deputies. §8107 of Chapter 8, Title 7, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended*, to read:

"§ 8107. Marshal; Appointment of Special Deputies.

The Chief Justice, at the request of the Marshal of the Court, may appoint employees of the Department of Law, the Department of Revenue & Taxation of the government of Guam, and the <u>Truancy School Attendance</u> Officers of the Department of Education as Special Deputy Marshals of the Guam Judiciary. Such appointments shall be for as long as such employees remain in their employment with their respective departments, unless sooner revoked by the Chief Justice, whichever is earlier.

(a) The <u>Truancy School Attendance</u> Officers of the Department of Education shall complete a training program developed and adopted by the Judicial Council, that is pertinent to their appointment, prior to such appointment as Special Deputy Marshals of the Guam Judiciary."

Section 3. Special Deputy Marshal; Duties, Compensation. §8108 of Chapter 8, Title 7, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended*, to read:

"§ 8108. Special Deputy Marshal; Duties, Compensation.

(a) The employees of the Department of Law who are appointed as deputies under §8107 of this Chapter *shall* exercise their office only in cases wherein the government of Guam is a party. The employees of the Department of Revenue and Taxation who are appointed as deputies under said §8107 *shall* exercise their office only in matters concerning the income tax laws and other tax and revenue laws of Guam. The <u>Truancy School Attendance</u> Officers of the Department of Education under §8107 *shall* exercise their office only in matters concerning truancy proceedings of the Superior Court of Guam. No deputies under said §8107 *shall* be entitled to compensation in addition to the compensation they are receiving as employees of the government of Guam."

Section 4. Public Safety and Law Enforcement Compensation Review.

A new Subsection (h) is hereby *added* to §55102, Article 1, Chapter 55, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"(h) Truancy Officers at the Guam Department of Education shall be included in the law enforcement compensation adjustment mandated by this section, provided they are appointed as Special Deputy Marshals of the Unified Judiciary of Guam under §8107 of Chapter 8, Title 7, Guam Code Annotated. Notwithstanding the provision of subsection (e) of this section, the pay adjustment authorized by this subsection shall be applied prospectively upon enactment."

6	"§ 6403. <u>Truancy</u> Attendance Officer.						
7	The Superintendent shall appoint employees of the Department						
8	of Education, as <u>Truancy</u> Attendance Officers. The <u>Truancy</u>						
9	Attendance Officers, any peace officer, principal, or dean may take						
10	into custody during school hours, without warrant, any truant found						
11	away from the truant's home and who has been reported truant. For						
12	the purposes of Title 10 GCA, Chapter 55, § 55102, Attendance						
13	Officers are not classified as public safety and law enforcement						
14	officers."						
15	Section 7. Replacement of Terms. Any references to "Attendance						
16	Officer" or "School Attendance Officer" and "Attendance Officers" or "School						
17	Attendance Officers" of the Department of Education, whether occurring in publi						
18	laws, executive orders, or rules and regulations shall be construed to mean						
19	"Truancy Officer" and "Truancy Officers", respectively.						
20	Section 8. Judiciary of Guam to Provide Resources to Truancy Officers.						
21	The Unified Judiciary of Guam shall annually provide such uniforms and						
22	equipment to deputy marshals serving as Truancy Officers of the Department of						
23	Education necessary for them to fulfill their duties and responsibilities as law						
24	enforcement personnel.						
25	Section 9. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon enactment. The						
26	pay adjustment authorized by §4 of this Act shall be applied prospectively upor						
27	enactment.
