N.B. Underwood, Ph.D. AN ACT TO AMEND § 3107 OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 3, TITLE 5 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. § 3107 of Article 1, Chapter 3, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated is 2 hereby amended to read: 3

"§ 3107. Department of Education. There is within the Executive Branch of the government of Guam a Department of Education. It is the mission of the Department of Education and the duty of all public officials of the Executive Branch of the government of Guam to provide an adequate public educational system as required by Section 29(b) of the Organic Act, as amended, and to that end provide an adequate public education for all public school students as those terms are defined at 1 GCA § 715; and to effectuate an increase in the percentage of the students at Level 3, which demonstrates solid academic performance as measured by SAT 10, by at least five percent (5%) each grade level per year until the Guam Education Policy Board's adopted goal of ninety percent (90%) at Level 3 in ten (10) years is reached of students by cohort.

Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions

- or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or
- 2 application and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
