## *I MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN* 2015 (FIRST) Regular Session

## AN ACT TO AMEND § 32113(b) OF CHAPTER 32, TITLE 22, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REQUIRED EXPERIENCE FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS, PROFESSIONAL ARCHITECTS AND PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYORS, AND CLARIFYING PROCESSES FOR APPLICANTS.

### **1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds 2 Section 1. that § 32113 of Chapter 32, Title 22, Guam Code Annotated (aka the PEALS law) 3 requires four years of professional experience before an individual may sit for the 4 Professional Engineer examination. However, the Board of Professional Engineers, 5 Architects and Land Surveyors (PEALS) Board, finds that Subsection (b)(1)(A) 6 also requires that these four years be completed *after* an individual successfully 7 8 passes the Fundamentals of Engineering examination. The potential for a similar 9 interpretation also exists within Subsection (b)(5)(A), relative to the experience required for the Professional Land Surveyors examination. 10

*I Liheslatura* further finds that this interpretation is inconsistent with the model law and rules established by the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Sciences (NCEES), of which the Guam PEALS Board is a member. The NCEES model law and rules do not restrict creditable experience to

begin after passing of the Fundamentals of Engineering examination or the 1 Fundamentals of Land Surveying examination. As such, and with the concurrence 2 of the Guam PEALS Board, it is the intent of *I Liheslatura* to amend the PEALS 3 law to be consistent with NCEES model law and rules. Additional amendments 4 5 were also made to these impacted sections, at the request of the Guam PEALS Board, in order to update existing law to match current practices and standards, 6 7 including updates related to changes in the Intern Development Program of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards. 8

- Section 2. §§ 32113(b)(1)(A), (B) and (C) of Chapter 32, Title 22, Guam 9 Code Annotated are hereby *amended* to read: 10

"(A) Licensure or Registration by Examination — An Engineer Intern 11 12 and a graduate of an engineering curriculum of four (4) years or more, accredited by EAC/ABET or the equivalent, with a specific record of an 13 additional four (4) years or more of progressive experience on engineering 14 projects of a grade and character which indicates to the Board that the 15 applicant may be competent to practice engineering, at least one (1) year of 16 which *shall* have been under the supervision of a registered professional 17 engineer, *shall* be admitted to a current form of examination in the principles 18 and practices of engineering, and in the case of specific engineering 19 disciplines, other examinations as prescribed in the by-laws. (Upon passing 20 such examination(s), the applicant shall be granted a certificate of 21 registration to practice engineering on Guam, provided the applicant is 22 otherwise qualified.) Creditable experience towards the required four (4) 23 years stipulated by this Subsection shall begin at a point after graduation 24 from an engineering program accredited by EAC/ABET, or the equivalent. 25

(B) Graduation, Experience and Examination - A graduate of an 26 engineering or related science curriculum of four (4) years or more, other 27

1 than the ones approved by the Board as being of satisfactory standing, and 2 with a specific record of eight (8) years or more of progressive experience. at least two (2) years of which shall have been under the supervision of a 3 registered engineer on projects of a grade and character which indicates to 4 the Board that the applicant may be competent to practice engineering, and 5 having passed a current form of examination in the fundamentals of 6 7 engineering shall may be admitted to a current form of examination in the fundamentals of engineering and a current form of examination in the 8 9 principles and practice of engineering as prescribed in the by-laws. Upon passing such examination, the applicant *shall* be granted a certificate of 10 registration to practice engineering on Guam, provided the applicant is 11otherwise qualified. 12

(C) A Non-graduate from a Technical Curriculum — A non-graduate 13 of an engineering or related science curriculum of four (4) years or more, 14 with a specific record of three (3) years or more in such a curriculum plus 15 twelve (12) years or more of progressive experience on engineering projects, 16 four (4) years of which must have been under the supervision of a registered 17 18 engineer, and of which at least six (6) years have been in responsible control of engineering projects of a grade and character which indicates to the Board 19 that the applicant may be competent to practice engineering, and having 20 passed a current form of examination in the fundamentals of engineering 21 shall may be admitted to a current form of examination in the fundamentals 22 of engineering and the principles and practice of engineering as prescribed in 23 the by-laws. Upon passing such examination, the applicant shall be granted a 24 certificate of registration to practice engineering on Guam, provided the 25 26 applicant is otherwise qualified."

Section 3. § 32113(b)(3) of Chapter 32, Title 22, Guam Code Annotated is 2 hereby *amended* to read:

"(3) As an Architect:

(A) Education, Experience and Examination — A graduate of an 4 5 NAAB accredited program from a school of architecture approved by the Board as being of satisfactory standing and with at least three (3) years of 6 7 progressive experience satisfactory to the Board in architectural work covering the major categories of architectural practice, at least two (2) years 8 of which shall have been under the supervision of a registered architect, and 9 having completed the Intern Development Program (IDP), shall be eligible 10 for a current form of examination as prescribed in the rules and regulations. 11 12 Upon passing such examination, the applicant *shall* be granted a certificate of registration to practice architecture in Guam, if the applicant is otherwise 13 qualified. 14

(i) Effective June 1, 2009, a new or inactive candidate applying 15 to the Board for eligibility evaluation for an applicant to the Architect 16 Registration Examination (ARE) shall, prior to registration or 17 18 licensure exam eligibility, complete the Intern Development Program (IDP) of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards 19 (NCARB), as defined herein and in the rules and regulations set forth, 20and the most recent or current form of IDP guidelines prepared and 21 prescribed by the NCARB. The IDP requirement does not apply to a 22 candidate who: 23

(aa) was determined by the Board to be eligible on or 24 before May 31, 2009 and who is active in the examination 25 26 process; or

1 completed all the necessary education (bb) has equivalents prior to June 1, 2009, who has submitted a 2 3 completed application for eligibility evaluation to the Board 4 that is postmarked on or before May 31, 2009, and who has been determined by the Board to be eligible. 5 6 (ii) An applicant shall obtain IDP certification upon completion of the Intern Development Program and shall submit such certificate 7 with application form new or inactive candidate shall submit an 8 9 application form, as prescribed and furnished by the Board, and accompanied by such supporting documents required herein. Such 10 supporting documents shall include the candidate's current and valid 11 IDP file transmitted by NCARB. 12

(iii) As an applicant eandidate acquires additional work 13 experience as required by the Board, it is the applicant's candidate's 14 responsibility to ensure that his/her employer(s) complete 15 16 Employment Verification Forms covering the additional work experience gained with that employer and that the forms are submitted 17 to the Board. Reporting shall be as per most current NCARB policies 18 and procedures. 19

# (iv) Completion of the IDP *shall* fulfill the lawful experience requirement provided in this Chapter, and in the rules and regulations.

(B) Experience and Examination – An applicant having eight (8) years
of architectural training or educational experience satisfactory to the Board,
of which a minimum of three (3) years *shall* be experience covering the
major categories of architectural practice under the supervision of a
registered architect, and having completed the Intern Development Program. *shall* be eligible for a current form of examination as prescribed in the rules

1	and regulations. Upon passing such examination, the applicant shall be			
2	granted a certificate of registration to practice architecture on Guam, if the			
3	applicant is otherwise qualified.			
4	(i) The requirements of § 32113(b)(3)(A)(i) through (iii) of this			
5	Chapter shall also apply to this subsection § 32113(b)(3)(B).			
6	(C) Licensure or Registration by Comity or Endorsement — A person			
7	shall be licensed or registered without further examination, if that person:			
8	(i) holds a current and valid registration issued by a registration			
9	authority recognized by the Board; or			
10	(ii) holds a National Council of Architectural Registration			
11	Board's Record; and			
12	(iii) files his application with the Board, upon a form prescribed			
13	and furnished by the Board, containing such information satisfactory			
14	to the Board, concerning the person, as the Board considers			
15	pertinent."			
16	Section 4. § 32113(b)(5)(A) of Chapter 32, Title 22, Guam Code Annotated			
17	is hereby <i>amended</i> to read:			
18	"(A) Licensure or Registration by Examination — A Surveyor Intern with			
19	a specific record of four (4) years or more of combined office and field			
20	experience satisfactory to the Board, in surveying, of which a minimum of			
21	three (3) years' progressive experience has been on surveying projects			
22	under the supervision of a professional surveyor, shall be eligible to take			
23	the current form of examination prepared and furnished by the NCEES in			
24	the principles and practice of land surveying, and in Guam Land Matters			
25	as prescribed in the by-laws. Upon passing such examination, the			
26	applicant shall be granted a certificate of registration to practice land			
27	surveying on Guam, provided the applicant is otherwise qualified.			

1 <u>Creditable experience towards the required four (4) years stipulated by</u> 2 <u>this Subsection may be completed at any point, prior to or after, the</u> 3 <u>applicant successfully passing the Fundamentals of Land Surveying</u> 4 <u>examination.</u>"

5 Section 5. Severability. *If* any of the provisions of this law or its 6 application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, 7 such invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this law which 8 can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the 9 provisions of this law are severable.
