AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FROM THE FY 2014 HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX (HOT) SURPLUS FUND FOR THE PAYMENT OF CAPITAL NEEDS OF THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY, OPERATIONAL FUNDING FOR THE GUAM VISITORS BUREAU, AND FUNDING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE HAGATNA RESTORATION AND REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
 that there exists Three Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,500,000) in the
 FY 2014 Hotel Occupancy Tax Surplus Fund available to appropriate to meet the
 capital needs of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, operational funding for
 the Guam Visitors Bureau, and operational funding requirements for the Hagatna
 Restoration and Redevelopment Authority.

8 Section 2. Appropriation. Notwithstanding any provision of law, the 9 sum of Three Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,500,000) is hereby 10 appropriated from the FY 2014 Hotel Occupancy Tax Surplus Fund for the 11 following:

(a) One Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,600,000) to the
Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for the purchase of a
Computerized Axial Tomography (CAT) Scan machine.

8	Section 3. Severability. If a provision f this act or its application to any					
9	person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other					
10	provisions or applications of this act that can be given effect without the invalid					
11	provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are severable.
