1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that the Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Program of the Guam Police
4 Department (GPD) provides training in law enforcement, operational techniques
5 and procedures for natural and man-made disasters the members of the Civilian
6 Volunteer Police Reserve (CVPR). When serving in an official capacity, members
7 of the CVPR are authorized to provide backup manpower for the suppression of
8 crime, preserve law and order, fight and control fires, and to assist in civil
9 emergencies alongside police officers of the Guam Police Department.

10 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to provide preferential
11 credit to members of the Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Program who would
12 like to serve as a full-time police officer within the Guam Police Department, and
13 who are in good standing with program requirements after having served a
14 minimum number of service credit hours to the island community.

1 **Section 2.** § 4104 of Article 1, Chapter 4, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated is
2 hereby *amended* to read:

3 **“§ 4104. Preferences.**

4 (a) No preference *shall* be given in the government service,
5 except that residents of Guam who are physically or mentally
6 impaired, but are physically and mentally able to perform efficiently
7 and safely the duties of the job being applied for as certified by the
8 Director of Public Health and Social Services, or who are veterans of
9 the Armed Forces of the United States, or who are former members of
10 the Guam Police Combat Patrol, as certified by the Chief of Police, or
11 graduates of the Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission
12 Academy operated pursuant to 17 GCA § 32201, as enacted by Public
13 Law Number 24-331, with respect to employment in those positions
14 identified in 17 GCA § 32301(b), as enacted by Public Law Number
15 24-331, *shall* receive a preferential credit of five (5) points, which
16 *shall* be added to their competitive examination score, and such
17 veterans or former members who are disabled as a result of their
18 service in the Armed Forces or Combat Patrol, or who are active
19 members of the Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Program that have
20 attained at least two thousand eighty (2,080) cumulative service hours
21 of community service and are graduates of the Peace Officer
22 Standards and Training Commission Academy operated pursuant to
23 17 GCA § 32201, as enacted by Public Law Number 24-331, with
24 respect to employment in those positions identified in 17 GCA §
25 32301(b), as enacted by Public Law Number 24-331, shall receive a
26 preferential credit of ten (10) points which *shall* be added to their
27 passing score. In addition, if two (2) applicants for government

1 service are equally qualified for the position to be filled, and one (1) is
2 a beneficiary of a preference pursuant to this Subsection, while the
3 other is not, the former shall be given the first offer of position.”
