Veto of Bill No. 1(1-S), authorizing the government of Guam to issue Solid Waste Management System Revenue Bonds *or* Section 30 Limited Obligation Bonds for the purpose of financing facilities of the Solid Waste Management System of Guam, and approving the terms and conditions of the issuance of one (1) *or* more series of such bonds pursuant to such article to pay the costs of a new landfill and the closure of the Ordot Landfill and other system costs.
