

Dear Speaker Won Pat:



Submitted herewith is Bill No. 117 (COR), "AN ACT TO ESTABLISH PROGRAM PROCUREMENT GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES, RELATIVE TO THE CONTRACTUAL REQUIREMENTS OF THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009," which I have vetoed.

Though I appreciate the Legislature's attempt to deal with the myriad of requirements expected by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, I am vetoing Bill No. 117 (COR) because processes, already mandated by Guam law, exist to meet ARRA mandates. Specifically, the government of Guam's existing program procurement guidelines and procedures are well tested and understood by the many agencies which will be in receipt of ARRA funds. For instance, the Bill as written remains silent on contractual projects which are funded by both ARRA monies and the Government of Guam. Should this project comply with our existing procedures, those intended by this Bill, or both on parallel tracks?

Changing this process midstream, by assigning program management to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, may cause unneeded confusion and costly delays. I would note that any error with regard to ARRA funding may cost the Government of Guam millions in needed stimulus funding.

Further, we cannot ignore that autonomous agencies like the Guam Waterworks Authority and the Guam Power Authority are fully capable of conducting their own procurement within the confines of law.

The Bill also mandates that the Lieutenant Governor establish the "ARRA Contracting Board" without expressly giving him the authority to create that entity. As you know, the Organic Act of Guam expressly authorizes the Governor to create boards—a power not organically granted to the Lieutenant Governor. As such Bill 117 (COR) would place the Lieutenant Governor in an untenable position.

Finally, and perhaps most important is the Bill's disregard for Executive level teamwork absent the mandates of statute. Governor Camacho may by his own authority, garner the full and complete assistance of the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, and a law memorializing that reality is superfluous and redundant.

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH PROGRAM PROCUREMENT GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES, RELATIVE TO THE CONTRACTUAL REQUIREMENTS OF THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Statement and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan
- 3 finds that there is a need to streamline and facilitate the procurement procedures
- 4 that govern the outlay of funds made available through the American Recovery and
- 5 Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) to provide full compliance and to meet

1 federally mandated fiduciary requirements. The people of Guam stand to receive

2 millions of dollars in ARRA funding for the enhancement of public facilities, the

improvement of the education system, the installation of new technology to meet

local, national and world-wide environmental standards, and for qualified capital

5 improvements which will improve the quality of life for all in our community.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds, having assessed the government of Guam's present capacity and historical ability to administer and maintain an effective system to manage federal grant awards of such magnitude and to meet the regulatory and financial reporting mandates of this, as well as, other federal programs that benefit Guam, that it is necessary and prudent to streamline and facilitate the system of procuring contractual services related to the outlay of ARRA funds by the government of Guam.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds, given the compressed timelines and stringent management and audit regulations that accompany the receipt and expenditure of ARRA funds, that it is necessary to assist the Administration to meet respective administrative and fiduciary obligations while ensuring full accountability of any ARRA funds expended for the benefit of Guam with the ultimate objective of maintaining Guam's eligibility to participate in such programs in the future and to restore faith and confidence in the government's ability to fulfill and comply with all federal and local regulatory guidelines and mandates that accompany the acceptance of such grants.

Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to establish program procurement guidelines and procedures for contractual requirements to meet the ARRA.

Section 2. American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Program Contractual and Procurement Authority. I Segundu na Maga'lahen Guåhan (Lieutenant Governor of Guam) is hereby granted the program contracting and

- 1 procuring authority for the government of Guam with specific regard to programs
- 2 and projects funded through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of
- 3 2009 (ARRA), as approved by *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* (Governor of Guam). This
- 4 mandate *shall* remain in effect throughout the full term of the present ARRA grant
- 5 period awarded in Fiscal Year 2009 or any continuation thereof, or for subsequent
- 6 grant award(s) to Guam under the ARRA.
- 7 Section 3. Authorization. I Segundu na Maga'lahen Guåhan (Lieutenant
- 8 Governor of Guam) is hereby authorized to allocate, transfer, expend and/or direct
- 9 resources under the charge of the Office of I Segundu na Maga'lahen Guåhan
- 10 (Lieutenant Governor of Guam) and the Guam State Clearinghouse, including,
- budgeted operating funds, staffing, materials and supplies, office space, equipment
- and any related logistic support and services required to fulfill the scope, purpose
- and intent of this Act. I Segundu na Maga'lahen Guåhan (Lieutenant Governor of
- 14 Guam) is designated the *sole* interim contracting, procuring and managing entity
- 15 authorized to report, advertise, administer, solicit, review and grant contractual
- 16 awards of the government of Guam funded under the American Recovery and
- 17 Reinvestment Act of 2009 as approved by I Maga'lahen Guåhan (Governor of
- 18 Guam).
- 19 Section 4. Establishment and Composition of the American Recovery
- 20 and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Contracting Board. (a) I Segundu na
- 21 Maga'lahen Guåhan (Lieutenant Governor of Guam) shall establish the American
- 22 Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) Contracting Board (Board)
- 23 which shall consist of eight (8) regular voting members and two (2) alternate
- 24 members who are allowed to cast a vote *only* in the event a regular voting member
- 25 is/are absent. The Board shall be comprised of members from the following
- 26 entities:
- 27 (1) I Segundu na Maga'lahen Guåhan (Lieutenant Governor of Guam);

Representative of the Guam Education Policy Board; 1 (2) 2 (3) Superintendent of Education or his/her designee; Chief Engineer of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency; 3 (4) Attorney General of Guam or his/her designee; 4 (5) 5 Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation or his/her (6) designee; 6 7 (7) Chief Engineer of the Department of Public Works; 8 Chief Procurement Officer of the government of Guam; (8) Director of the Guam State Clearinghouse (Alternate); and 9 (9)Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research or 10 (10)his/her designee (Alternate). 11 Duties and Responsibilities Granted. Notwithstanding any other 12 (b) provision of law, the scope of authority, duties, and responsibilities granted in this 13 14 Section *shall* be for the purpose of: 15 program administration and management of ARRA funds awarded to (1) Guam in 2009 or thereafter, in accordance with applicable local and 16 federal laws; 17 announcement, solicitation and awards of bids for qualified programs (2) 18 19 and projects funded through the ARRA of 2009 and any continuation 20 of ARRA programs thereafter; 21 (3) receipt and protection of sealed bids, request for proposals (RFP) and 22 request for interest (RFI), request for quotations (RFQ) and any other government of Guam solicitation, in accordance with established local 23 procurement rules and regulations, and ARRA procedures and 24 guidelines, to ensure fair and lawful procurement practices and 25

compliance with federal and local laws;

developing periodic reports on expenditures, encumbrances, balances, fund reallocation and any other financial transaction or activity affecting the status of ARRA funds, while insuring compliance with ARRA requirements;

- (5) maintaining project status reports, financial status reports and documentation of financial transactions affecting the fund balance(s) of grant accounts for audit and project close-out requirements for corresponding grant award year(s); and
- 9 (6) preparation of quarterly financial report(s) on ARRA-funded projects and programs for submission to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.

The Board *shall* meet as necessary to comply with this Section. *I Segundu* na Maga'lahen Guåhan (Lieutenant Governor of Guam) *shall* act as the interim ARRA Chief Contracting Officer, as stated in Section 5 of this Act, until such time a person is designated to this position.

Section 5. Establishment and Recruitment of the Chief Contracting Officer.

I Segundu na Maga'lahen Guåhan (Lieutenant Governor of Guam) is authorized to establish an unclassified position to be designated as the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) Chief Contracting Officer, who shall provide administrative and management support to the Board, as stated in Section 4 of this Act. Such ARRA Chief Contracting Officer shall possess the following combination of skill and experience:

- (a) no less than five (5) years of experience in administering and managing capital improvement programs funded by federal, state, municipal, or private funds;
- (b) ability to develop and administer contracting and procurement procedures for use and adoption by the ARRA Contracting Authority;

(c) ability and experience in preparing or coordinating the preparation of financial and other required reports for ARRA programs and projects as mandated by federal, state and local authorities;

- (d) contracting experience in federal (U.S. Government) and government of Guam-funded CIP, and sufficient knowledge of procurement practices and regulations applicable to both; and
- (e) ability to administer and develop public education and information programs, advertising, business relations, media announcements and a public relations campaign to promote the ARRA programs of the government of Guam.
- Section 6. Appropriation. The sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of *I Segundu na Maga'lahen Guåhan* (Lieutenant Governor of Guam) to partly defray the costs of implementing the provisions of this Act, and *shall* be used for funding the salary and benefits of the Chief Contracting Officer, contractual services, supplies, materials and other operating needs of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Contracting Board.
- **Section 7. Effective Date.** This Act *shall* become effective upon enactment. The designation of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Chief Contracting Officer *shall* become effective within sixty (60) days upon enactment of this Act.
- **Section 8. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law, which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
