Dear Madame Speaker:

Attached is Bill No. 9-32 (COR), entitled, ***“An act to add new §§ 58148, 58148.1, 58148.2, 58148.3, and 58149 to Chapter 58 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, and amend Sections of Chapter 58 of Title 12 Guam Code Annotated, relative to establishing the Qualifying Certificate Review Board, the Qualifying Certificate Accountability and Transparency website, and for other purposes,”*** which I have vetoed.

I am vetoing Bill 9-32 because it does nothing to improve the already exhaustive multi-step Qualifying Certificate (QC) application review process. It only introduces duplicative, redundant processes which could slow economic growth and very well spawn excessive regulatory litigation.

Under Bill 9-32, the Review Board is charged with scrutinizing QC applications, providing public notification of board meetings to review and discuss the applications, and holding a public hearing prior to decision on any application or extension. It even utilizes GEDA staff to carry out some of the Review Board's responsibilities. The Review Board then provides a report of its recommendations to GEDA.

This process is almost identical to the significant QC review procedures that are already undertaken by GEDA. Currently, and even after receipt of the Review Board's report under Bill 9032, there would be an application review by a GEDA underwriter, a public notice and public hearing, a review by GEDA's internal Credit Review Committee, GEDA's management and its Board of Directors, a review by the Attorney General, and finally, a review by the Governor of Guam. The Credit Review Committee, which is comprised of its executive management, division managers and two members of the GEDA Board, is already charged with analyzing and providing substantiated recommendations on all requests for GEDA programs, including the QC program; thus it already conducts the same economic analysis contemplated under Bill 9-32.

In short, Bill 9-32 does little else besides adding an extra layer of bureaucracy, that potentially hampers economic growth through unnecessary delay and expense.

Bill 9-32 is also technically and legally flawed in that it requires GEDA to publically post on a website the monthly reports that are filed by a QC beneficiary, contrary to current law, namely 12 G.C.A. Section 58123, that explicitly requires that, "All such monthly reports shall be treated as confidential by [GEDA]."

Finally, Bill 9-32 fails to make any appropriation or identify the funding source for the new mandates being implanted by the bill.

If the Legislature feels that the current QC process lacks adequate public review or processes, my recommendation is to refine existing statutes to expand or contract the GEDA review process, not increase the layers of regulatory oversight and bureaucracy by adding another board, commission or agency to the process. The government needs to focus on outcomes that will attract investors who can provide critically needed jobs and economic growth and opportunities our island and its people. My Administration looks forward to working with *Liheslaturan Guåhan* in achieving these goals.







AN ACT TO *ADD* NEW §§ 58148, 58148.1, 58148.2, 58148.3 AND 58149; AND TO *AMEND* §§ 58126 AND 58115(c), ALL OF CHAPTER 58 OF TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE QUALIFYING CERTIFICATE REVIEW BOARD, AND THE QUALIFYING CERTIFICATE ACCOUNTABILITY AND TRANSPARENCY WEBSITE; AND AMENDING CONFLICTS OF INTEREST PROVISIONS.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** Pursuant to and in

3 conformance with the practice of the open government laws of Guam, this Act is

1 prescribed by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* for the benefit of Guam resident taxpayers
2 and local businesses operating without the benefits of a Qualifying Certificate, who
3 bear the cost of tax revenues rebated and abated resulting from the granting who
4 bear the loss of tax revenues resulting from the granting of Qualifying Certificates
5 (QCs) by the Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA).

6 *I Liheslatura* finds that certain companies are granted amendments to the
7 terms and conditions of specific QC requirements without maximum opportunity
8 for proper internal government and public scrutiny. The reasons for such actions
9 vary; the most common reason being the company's inability to fulfill
10 contractually binding obligations due to financial or economic hardship.

11 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that for whatever reason amendments to
12 the terms and conditions of the QCs are granted, and there are concerns about the
13 government's due diligence during this process, and public disclosure and
14 administrative transparency is needed when granting these amendments.

15 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the importance of fulfilling QC
16 obligations, which are binding contractual agreements between the recipient and
17 the people of Guam, is paramount; and stricter administrative and enforcement
18 initiatives adopted and performed by the GEDA, is necessary. Improvement of
19 current monitoring and enforcement practices while enhancing the government's
20 ability to responsibly manage QC entitlements, and to prevent any effort to
21 minimize or circumvent the full force and effect of the tax policies of Guam, are
22 essential for maximum positive impact of the QC program.

23 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to establish a Qualifying
24 Certificate Review Board, to review all new applications for Qualifying
25 Certificates, all applications requesting to amend original or amended QCs, and/or
26 all extensions of QCs, and to ensure transparency in the discussions,
27 recommendations, and approval of those applications. Furthermore, it is also the

1 intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to create the Qualifying Certificate Accountability
2 and Transparency Website for the sole purpose of increasing accountability and
3 transparency within the Qualifying Certificate Program.

4 **Section 2. Establishment of the Qualifying Certificate Review Board.**

5 New §§ 58148, 58148.1, 58148.2, and 58148.3 are hereby *added* to Chapter 58 of
6 Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

7 **“§ 58148. The Qualifying Certificate Review Board.** The
8 Qualifying Certificate Review Board (Review Board) is hereby established,
9 whose members *shall* consist of the Administrator of the Guam Economic
10 Development Authority (GEDA), the Director of Revenue and Taxation, the
11 Attorney General of Guam or his/her designee, the Chief Economist of the
12 Department of Labor, and the Chief Economist of the Bureau of Statistics
13 and Plans. The members *shall* convene and elect a Chairperson, and
14 thereafter when called upon by the Chairperson *shall* review all new
15 Qualifying Certificate applications, all applications to amend original or
16 amended Qualifying Certificates, and all applications for extension of the
17 term of all existing Qualifying Certificates’ terms and conditions.

18 **§58148.1. Applications for New Qualifying Certificates.** After
19 careful review and scrutiny of the applications for new Qualifying
20 Certificates, it *shall* be the duty of the Review Board to provide a detailed
21 report to include, but *not* be limited to, those specific findings as required in
22 § 58109, Chapter 58, Title 12 GCA, to the GEDA Board of Directors.

23 **§58148.2. Applications Requesting Amendments or Extensions**
24 **of Existing Qualifying Certificates.**

25 (a) **Reporting Requirements.** After careful review and scrutiny of
26 an application or notification to amend an original or amended Qualifying
27 Certificate, or for the extension of the term of an existing Qualifying

1 Certificate or any of its terms and conditions, it *shall* be the duty of the
2 Review Board to provide a detailed report prior to the GEDA Board's
3 disposition of any application or prior to an extension. This report *shall* be
4 provided to the GEDA Board of Directors, and *shall* include:

5 (1) an analysis of the direct impact of the amendment on
6 additional or lost revenue to the government of Guam.

7 (2) an analysis of the direct impact of the amendment on Net
8 Profit Margin presented in gross dollars and a percentage taken or
9 calculated in the audit report required in Subsection (c).

10 (3) the Net Profit Margin percentage used in Subsection a(2)
11 *shall* be compared against a published reasonable industry standard,
12 such as Standard and Poors Key Industry Ratios.

13 (4) when amendments reduce requirement thresholds of the
14 recipient, the Review Board *shall* assume the maximum impact.

15 (5) recommendations on the disposition of the application or
16 notification.

17 (6) the Review Board *shall* submit its report with
18 recommendations and findings to *I Maga'låhen Guåhan, I*
19 *Liheslaturan Guåhan*, and the Board of Directors of the GEDA.

20 (b) Upon receipt of an application or notification to amend or
21 extend an original or amended Qualifying Certificate, the Chairperson of the
22 Review Board *shall* represent the government of Guam in any subsequent
23 discussion, meetings or any other administrative matter(s) or affair(s) that
24 pertain specifically to the amendments or any binding obligation or
25 agreements to an existing Qualifying Certificate prior to action by the
26 GEDA Board on the application or notification.

1 (c) The Administrator of the GEDA *shall* within seven (7) days of
2 its receipt forward to the Chairperson of the Review Board all applications
3 or notifications to amend or extend an original or amended Qualifying
4 Certificate. The Review Board in processing all applications may
5 recommend approving, disapproving, amending, reconsidering, suspending
6 or revising all applications or notifications to amend or extend an original or
7 amended Qualifying Certificates. The Review Board *shall* be provided with
8 the applicant’s audited financial statement by an independent auditor within
9 eighteen (18) months of the date of the application, the terms and conditions
10 of the current Qualifying Certificate, and other documents necessary for the
11 preparation of its report and recommendation. GEDA *shall* further provide
12 the Review Board with complete administrative data, information, records,
13 exhibits and correspondence of the applicant, which are essential or relevant
14 to the applicant’s Qualifying Certificate amendment request.

15 (d) GEDA *shall* advise all Qualifying Certificate recipients of the
16 provisions contained in this Section and *shall* perform its prescribed
17 administrative obligations accordingly. The provisions of this Section *shall*
18 affect *only* those applicants whose application or notification for
19 amendment, revision, or extension is received after April 30, 2013.

20 (e) Notwithstanding any other laws, procedures or rules and
21 regulations of the government of Guam applicable to the Qualifying
22 Certificate program established pursuant to Chapter 58 of Title 12 GCA, the
23 provisions of this Section *shall* serve to lawfully augment the existing
24 policies of Guam which relate to the amendment of original and amended
25 terms and conditions of Guam’s Qualifying Certificate Program.

26 **§ 58148.3. Review Board Meetings.** The Review Board *shall* provide
27 public notification pursuant to the Open Government Law, Chapter 8, Title 5 GCA,

1 of all meetings scheduled to review and discuss the applications submitted. Review
2 Board meetings *shall* include a public hearing component prior to decision on any
3 application or extension pursuant to the Administration Adjudication Law and the
4 Open Government Law.

5 (a) For applications for new Qualifying Certificates, the Review
6 Board *shall* cause to be performed all required publication of applications
7 and public notices to be at the expense of the applicant, pursuant to Chapter
8 58, Title 12 GCA. The GEDA’s staff may be utilized to perform the duties
9 required in this Subsection (a).

10 (b) The individual, corporation, business or entity requesting
11 amendments or extensions to a Qualifying Certificate *shall* pay for the cost
12 of the public notification and any audits, if necessary, at such amounts as
13 determined by the Review Board.”

14 **Section 3. Creation of the Qualifying Certificate Accountability and**
15 **Transparency Website.** A new § 58149 is hereby *added* to Chapter 58 of Title
16 12, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

17 “**§58149. The Qualifying Certificate Accountability and**
18 **Transparency Website.** The GEDA *shall* create, or cause to be created, the
19 Qualifying Certificate Accountability and Transparency Website (Q-CAT Website)
20 for the sole purpose of increasing accountability and transparency in the Qualifying
21 Certificate Program. Funding for the Q-CAT Website is hereby continuously
22 appropriated from the annual Qualifying Certificate Program fees charged and
23 collected by the GEDA. The Q-CAT Website *shall* include, but *not* be limited to,
24 the following:

25 (a) Electronic copies of all new applications for Qualifying
26 Certificates within fifteen (15) days of receipt of said application(s).

1 (b) Electronic copies of all applications to amend original or
2 amended Qualifying Certificates and/or for the extension of the term of
3 existing Qualifying Certificates' terms and conditions within fifteen (15)
4 days of receipt of said application(s).

5 (c) Electronic copies of the monthly reports required to be
6 submitted pursuant to § 58123, Chapter 58, Title 12 GCA within fifteen (15)
7 days of receipt of said report.

8 (d) All notices of hearings required in § 58125, Chapter 58, Title
9 12 GCA.

10 (e) All recommendations made by the GEDA Board of Directors to
11 the Governor, pursuant to § 58126, within five (5) days of making such
12 recommendation.

13 The GEDA is required to create, or cause to be created, the Q-CAT Website
14 within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Act.”

15 **Section 4.** § 58126 of Chapter 58 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, is
16 hereby *amended* to read as follows:

17 **“§58126. Recommendations.**

18 The GEDA Board of Directors *shall not* provide any recommendations to
19 the Governor of Guam without receipt and review of the Review Board’s detailed
20 report as required in §§ 58148.1 and 58148.2. All recommendations of the
21 Authority for the issuance, modification, renovation and suspension of Qualifying
22 Certificates *shall* be forwarded to the Governor of Guam, together with a
23 memorandum of the Authority’s findings in support of its recommendations. Any
24 recommendation of the Authority *not* approved by the Governor within sixty (60)
25 calendar days from his receipt thereof *shall* be deemed disapproved on the sixty-
26 first (61st) day following such receipt.”

1 **Section 5.** § 58115(c) of Chapter 58 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, is
2 hereby *amended* to read as follows:

3 “(c) The Governor of Guam, the Lieutenant Governor of Guam, and their
4 spouses; and person or spouse of such person related by consanguinity of the third
5 degree, which for the purposes of this Section *shall* include spouses, all children,
6 parents, grandchildren, siblings, grandparents, great-grandchildren, nieces,
7 nephews, uncles, aunts, and great-grandparents, to the Governor and the Lieutenant
8 Governor of Guam;”

9 **Section 6. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Act or its application to
10 any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity *shall not* affect other
11 provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid
12 provision or application and to this end the provisions of this Act is severable.






II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

Chairman Pangelinan: The next item on the agenda is Bill No. 09-32. It's an act to add new Section 58148, 58148.1, 58148.2, 58148.3, and 58149 to Chapter 58, Title 12 Guam Code Annotated and to amend Sections of Chapter 58, Title 12 Guam Code Annotated, relative to establishing the Qualifying Certificate Review Board, the Qualifying Certificate Accountability and Transparency website and for other purposes. We have [former] Senator Ysrael on the GEDA bill.

(a) Bill Sponsor Summary

Chairman Pangelinan: Thank you very much. The bill is authored by myself. Very quickly, the bill would provide a new layer of review for recommendations on the issuance of the Qualifying Certificate Program. Right now, all applications with the Qualifying Certificate Program are reviewed and analyzed by the staff of the Guam Economic Development Authority. Revenues derived from the granting of qualifying certificates goes to support the operations of GEDA. And in such, in my opinion presents an inherent conflict in that when you grant a qualifying certificate, you get more money for your operations. And therefore, there may be a built in bias in that process to grant these so we can get more money for our operations. And so what we wanted to do is present a more macro-review with regards to the government of Guam itself and its operations with regards to the revenues that may be abated or rebated with the granting of these QCs and taking a look from a government-wide perspective rather than from an agency or entity, insular perspective. And so the bill would set up a review board for recommendations to the Guam Economic Development Authority Board before making a recommendation to the Governor on whether or not these qualifying certificates and tax abatements should be granted.

That is the basic intent of the bill and I'll go ahead and begin with [former] Senator Ysrael.

(b) Testimony

1. Mr. Al Ysreal

Mr. Ysrael: My name Alfred C. Ysrael, I'm a private individual; a taxpaying private individual, a productive individual in our island community. Let's cut to the chase, regrettably my recommendation would be, is that this bill is redundant. If something is broken you throw it away if it can't be fixed. And GEDA cannot be fixed. Adding another layer of bureaucracy is redundant. In my opinion, it's a personal opinion, GEDA has become redundant and has outlived its usefulness. GEDA's main purpose right now is to act as a financing expert to GovGuam for their bond issues. The era of qualifying certificates are long gone. Why continue GEDA when they're not enforcing their own rules and regulations against or towards the QC holders? I was the recipient of a QC holder until I read the conditions and knowing the way the bureaucracy works, those conditions would be selectively enforced against me. I know that from practical experience.

To begin with, there are, starting at Section 58100, which is the legislative findings and intent for GEDA, all the way up to Sections 58118, these are the conditions that GEDA has imposed on the QC holders, none of which have been enforced or collected. And one of the provisions of GEDA QC holders is the fact that if they don't follow or enforce the conditions, their benefits are retroactively refunded. That would be quite a windfall for GovGuam to get back all the refunds that they've been receiving over the last 30 years. One in particular has had their QC renewed on three different occasions. The incentive to invest in Guam is not there anymore, it is lucrative. We don't have to give them this incentive anymore. I'm sorry, but I was just told about this 30 minutes ago at 8:30 this morning.

So therefore, if there's going to be, if anything is going to make sense, is to do two things. Require the GEDA officials to enforce the rules and conditions. Second, abolish GEDA. The one thing for example, that they're supposed to do, under Paragraph 58118 as part of their condition is that no resident employee of a beneficiary shall be paid less than the prevailing wage rate established by the Department of Labor nor shall employees be laid off nor have his or her work week reduced to less than 40 hours. That's one of the main conditions. It hasn't been enforced. I know that for a fact. Every hotel pays barely minimum wage, that's the only way they can do it. Why has not somebody been enforcing these rules of GEDA and allowing the QC holders to keep continuing receiving their many tax rebates, their real estate rebates, and sometimes even their gross receipts tax?

Another condition is the Authority shall be the sole judge whether beneficiaries' employment is management or non-management. Authority shall report to the Legislature the titles and compensation of all trainees including those placed in management positions. That has not been enforced because that's a prerogative of management. And yet this is one of the conditions.

Paragraph 58113, this is my favorite paragraph. Retroactive suspension, rescission, or revocation of a QC may be retroactive to the act or omission giving rights to the suspension. Nothing has been enforced. It was only enforced once in the entire history of GEDA - against me. When I relocated a restaurant from the roof, to the first floor, they said that was a violation and then therefore I am in violation. Local shareholders requiring the beneficiary to offer ten percent or more of its corporate equity to qualified residents of Guam on terms and conditions to be established by the GEDA authority. I can't think of any hotel that's done that who has received QCs. Public investments conditioning the tax benefits on the beneficiaries investing in or creating public improvements separate from its proposed activities. It goes on and on and these are conditions by which they received their QC.; conditions, which have not been enforced or applied or put into effect. So gentlemen, your proposed bill is redundant. If anything, it should be revoked completely and more importantly, the Department of Labor or some other enforcing bodies should go and look into possibility of a refund of all of their tax benefits in the past. Thank you gentlemen. I'm open to questions if there's any.

PANEL COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Chairman Pangelinan: Thank you very much [former] Senator Ysrael. Senator, the reason why we've introduced this bill is because, as you mentioned, non-enforcement. These QC recipients come in, apply to GEDA, GEDA gets fees from granting QCs for them to fund themselves for their off-island trips, their pay raises outside of the GovGuam employees. So they grant QCs then they come in and ask for modifications and modification, more fees and so forth. And we don't hear about these modifications and no one reviews them except the GEDA internally and so forth. So that's why we're adding, we're opening up those doors for that review process to the other entities that have an interest other than the interest of GEDA itself.

This would open up the doors, put a little bit of transparency and accountability and public scrutiny over it, requiring additional public hearings for these modifications, and hopefully put some of these things out in the open, rather than keeping them behind closed doors, internal to GEDA and the granting of that. While I understand the recommendation of 'let's just do away with it,' I'm sure there's somebody here that may jump on that. But if we can't do it, or we don't do it, how do we open up that process right now that stops some of these things due to the fact that we're going to provide greater public participation, public scrutiny over these qualifying certificates. So that's our intention here and it's not a perfect approach, but it certainly is better than the system that exists today.

Mr. Ysrael: Senator, if I may respond. The road to hell is paved with good intentions. Adding another layer of bureaucracy adding another board supervision.... After six years of experience with government entities and boards, you notice one thing, that the boards become polluted, become infected, and they become part of the problem. Have any of our board members really acted on behalf of, or for the benefit of the public? They eventually become part of the problem. They become infected with the

bureaucratic mentality of the permanent civil service organization because of the benefits that the board members will receive from them.

A great case is our Public Utilities Agency. They're here to protect our public and this gentleman asked to give us relief. I recall full well just about two weeks ago, a statement made by GPA to the effect is, there will be savings made by this so-called smart meters, and we may pass it on to the consumers. I'm quoting his exact words because its embedded in my mind and it may be passed on to the consumers rather than saying it will be passed on to the consumers. Have any of the benefits been passed on to the consumers?

Chairman Pangelinan: I share the same frustrations.

Mr. Ysrael: And why add another bureaucracy? Something is rotten, get rid of it, or better, still bring all those agencies back again into the realm of the control of the Legislature and the Executive. Right now, the agencies are independent and there's nothing you can do about them as you yourself know from your own experience.

Chairman Pangelinan: Thank you very much. Any comments or questions? Senator?

Vice Speaker Cruz: I just want to make one comment, Senator Ysrael I know you said you just had a short notice about this, I think you could still submit written testimony and I know that you can write, because I've seen it. Sit down and write your testimony so we can have it on record. To have everything that you believe we should have. And so I just wanted to remind you that you can. I know you can do much better than that. Go ahead and send us written testimony.

Mr. Ysrael: I can't sleep at tonight...Thank you gentlemen, and ladies.

Chairman Pangelinan: Thank you. Any other public testimony on Bill No. 09-32? Mr. [former] Vice Speaker? Yes, yes, of course. Thank you very much Mr. [former] Vice Speaker, welcome.

2. Mr. Ted Nelson

Mr. Nelson: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Senators, my name is Ted Nelson and I feel nauseated from the testimony of this man right next to me [referring to Mr. Al Ysrael]. Mr. Chairman, can you please give GEDA the authority to investigate companies that are operating illegally or questionably on private property in Gogna? I think that this is something that's more serious. I think that if GEDA can do that, it will benefit this island, it will benefit Chamorros who are denied of their right for their ancestral property. I think GEDA should be the policing agency and if any one of these organizations, hotels, whatever they are, beach clubs are getting GEDA to give them the biggest properties, I think that you should amend the law to authorize them to investigate this type of activity. Thank you.

PANEL COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you very much Mr. [former] Vice Speaker. Thank you very much [former] Senator Ysrael. We'll go ahead then and conclude the receipt of oral testimony this morning. As the Vice Speaker noted, written testimony will continue to be received by the Committee on any and all of the bills that are up for a public hearing this morning. We encourage you to do so.

This concludes the testimony on Bill No. 9. There being no additional individuals to present any additional testimony, this Committee will continue to remain open for the acceptance of any additional information or public testimony on the bill discussed. AN ACT TO *ADD* NEW §§ 58148, 58148.1, 58148.2, 58148.3, AND 58149 TO CHAPTER 58 OF TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AND *AMEND* SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 58 OF TITLE 12 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE QUALIFYING CERTIFICATE REVIEW BOARD, THE QUALIFYING CERTIFICATE ACCOUNTABILITY AND TRANSPARENCY WEBSITE, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

1 **SECTION 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** Pursuant to and in
2 conformance with the practice of the open government laws of Guam, this
3 Act is prescribed by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* for the benefit of Guam resident
4 taxpayers and local businesses operating without the benefits of a Qualifying
5 Certificate, who bear the cost of tax revenues rebated and abated resulting
6 from the granting who bear the loss of tax revenues resulting from the
7 granting of Qualifying Certificates (QCs) by the Guam Economic
8 Development Authority (GEDA).

9 *I Liheslatura* finds that certain companies are granted amendments to
10 the terms and conditions of specific QC requirements without maximum
11 opportunity for internal government and public scrutiny proper scrutiny. The

1 reasons for such actions vary; the most common reason being the company's
2 inability to fulfill contractually binding obligations due to financial or
3 economic hardship.

4 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that for whatever reason
5 amendments to the terms and conditions of the QCs are granted, there are
6 concerns about the government's due diligence during this process and
7 public disclosure and administrative transparency when granting these
8 amendments.

9 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the importance of fulfilling
10 QC obligations, which are binding contractual agreements between the
11 recipient and the people of Guam is paramount, however stricter
12 administrative and enforcement initiatives adopted and performed by the
13 GEDA, is necessary. Improvement of current monitoring and enforcement
14 practices while enhancing the government's ability to responsibly manage
15 QC entitlements, and to prevent any effort to minimize or circumvent the
16 full force and effect of the tax policies of Guam, are essential for maximum
17 positive impact of the QC program.

18 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to establish a
19 Qualifying Certificate Review Board, to review all new applications for
20 Qualifying Certificates, all applications requesting to amend original or
21 amended QCs, and/or all extensions of QCs, and to ensure transparency in
22 the discussions, recommendations, and approval of those applications.
23 Furthermore, it is also the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to create the
24 Qualifying Certificate Accountability and Transparency Website for the sole
25 purpose of increasing accountability and transparency within the Qualifying
26 Certificate Program.

1 **SECTION 2. Establishment of the Qualifying Certificate**
2 **Review Board.** New §§ 58148, 58148.1, 58148.2, and 58148.3 are hereby
3 *added* to Chapter 58 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

4 “**§ 58148. The Qualifying Certificate Review Board.** The
5 Qualifying Certificate Review Board is hereby established, herein referred to
6 as “*Review Board*,” whose members *shall* consist of the Administrator of the
7 Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA), the Director of Revenue
8 and Taxation, the Attorney General of Guam or his/her designee, the Chief
9 Economist of the Department of Labor, and the Chief Economist of the
10 Bureau of Statistics and Plans. The members *shall* convene and elect a
11 Chairperson, and thereafter when called upon by the Chairperson *shall*
12 review all new Qualifying Certificate applications, all applications to amend
13 original or amended Qualifying Certificates, and all applications for
14 extension of the term of all existing Qualifying Certificates’ terms and
15 conditions.

16 **§ 58148.1. Applications for New Qualifying Certificates.** After
17 careful review and scrutiny of the applications for new Qualifying
18 Certificates, it *shall* be the duty of the Review Board to provide a detailed
19 report to include, but not be limited to, those specific findings as required in
20 § 58109, Chapter 58, Title 12 GCA, to the GEDA Board of Directors.

21 **§ 58148.2. Applications Requesting Amendments or Extensions of**
22 **Existing Qualifying Certificates.**

23 (a) **Reporting Requirements.** After careful review and scrutiny of the
24 applications to amend original or amended Qualifying Certificates
25 and/or for the extension of the term of existing Qualifying
26 Certificates’ terms and conditions, it *shall* be the duty of the

1 Review Board to provide a detailed report to the GEDA Board of
2 Directors, to include:

- 3 (1). an analysis of the direct impact of the amendment on
4 additional or lost revenue to the government of Guam.
- 5 (2). an analysis of the direct impact of the amendment on Net
6 Profit Margin presented in gross dollars and a percentage
7 taken or calculated in the audit report required in Subsection
8 (c).
- 9 (3). the Net Profit Margin percentage used in Subsection (2)
10 *shall* be compared against a published reasonable industry
11 standard, such as Standard and Poors Key Industry Ratios.
- 12 (4). when amendments reduce requirement thresholds of the
13 recipient, the Review Board *shall* assume the maximum
14 impact.
- 15 (5). the Review Board *shall* submit its report with
16 recommendations and findings to *I Maga'låhen Guåhan, I*
17 *Liheslaturan Guåhan*, and the Board of Directors of the
18 GEDA.

19 (b) Upon receipt of an application to amend or extend an original or
20 amended Qualifying Certificate, the Chairperson of the Review
21 Board *shall* represent the government of Guam in any subsequent
22 discussion, meetings or any other administrative matter(s) or
23 affair(s) that pertain specifically to the amendments or any binding
24 obligation or agreements to an existing Qualifying Certificate.

25 (c) The Administrator of the GEDA *shall* within seven (7) days of its
26 receipt forward to the Chairperson of the Review Board all
27 applications to amend or extend original or amended Qualifying

1 Certificates. The Review Board in processing all applications may
2 recommend amending, reconsidering, suspending and revising all
3 applications to amend original or amended Qualifying Certificate
4 or extension of Qualifying Certificates and *shall* be provided the
5 applicant's audited financial statement by an independent auditor
6 within eighteen (18) months of the date of the application, the
7 terms and conditions of the current Qualifying Certificate and
8 other documents necessary for the preparation of its report and
9 recommendation. The GEDA *shall* further provide the Review
10 Board with complete administrative data, information, record(s),
11 exhibits and correspondence of the applicant(s), which are
12 essential or relevant to the applicant's Qualifying Certificate
13 amendment request.

14 (d) The GEDA *shall* advise all Qualifying Certificate recipients of the
15 provisions contained in this Section and *shall* perform its
16 prescribed administrative obligations accordingly. The provisions
17 of this Section *shall* affect *only* those applicants whose application
18 for amendment, revision, or extension is received after April 30,
19 2013.

20 (e) Notwithstanding any other laws, procedures or rules and
21 regulations of the government of Guam applicable to the
22 Qualifying Certificate program established pursuant to Chapter 58
23 of Title 12 GCA, the provisions of this Section *shall* serve to
24 lawfully augment the existing policies of Guam, which relate to the
25 amendment of original and amended terms and conditions of
26 Guam's Qualifying Certificate Program.

1 **§ 58148.3. Review Board Meetings.** The Review Board *shall* provide
2 public notification pursuant to the Open Government Law, Chapter 8, Title 5
3 GCA, of all meetings scheduled to review and discuss the applications
4 submitted. Review Board meetings *shall* include a public hearing component
5 pursuant to the Administration Adjudication Law and the Open Government
6 Law.

7 (a) For applications for new Qualifying Certificates, the Review Board
8 *shall* cause to be performed, all required publication of
9 applications and public notices to be at the expense of the
10 applicant, pursuant to Chapter 58, Title 12 GCA. The GEDA's
11 staff *may* be utilized to perform the duties required in this
12 Subsection (a).

13 (b) The individual, corporation, business or entity requesting
14 amendments or extensions to a Qualifying Certificate *shall* pay for
15 the cost of the public notification and any audits, if necessary, at
16 such amounts as determined by the Review Board.”

17 **SECTION 3. Creation of the Qualifying Certificate**
18 **Accountability and Transparency Website.** A new § 58149 is hereby
19 *added* to Chapter 58 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

20 **“§ 58149. The Qualifying Certificate Accountability and**
21 **Transparency Website.** The GEDA shall create, or cause to be created, the
22 Qualifying Certificate Accountability and Transparency Website (Q-CAT
23 Website) for the sole purpose of increasing accountability and transparency
24 in the Qualifying Certificate Program. Funding for the Q-CAT Website is
25 hereby continuously appropriated from the annual Qualifying Certificate
26 Program fees charged and collected by the GEDA. The Q-CAT Website
27 shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

1 (a) Electronic copies of all new applications for Qualifying
2 Certificates within fifteen (15) days of receipt of said
3 application(s).

4 (b) Electronic copies of all applications to amend original or amended
5 Qualifying Certificates and/or for the extension of the term of
6 existing Qualifying Certificates' terms and conditions within
7 fifteen (15) days of receipt of said application(s).

8 (c) Electronic copies of the monthly reports required to be submitted
9 pursuant to § 58123, Chapter 58, Title 12 GCA within fifteen (15)
10 days of receipt of said report.

11 (d) All notices of hearings required in § 58125, Chapter 58, Title 12
12 GCA.

13 (e) All recommendations made by the GEDA Board of Directors
14 pursuant to § 58126 to the Governor within five (5) days of making
15 such recommendation.

16 The GEDA is required to create, or cause to be created, the Q-CAT
17 Website within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Act.”

18 **SECTION 4.** A § 58126 of Chapter 58 of Title 12, Guam Code
19 Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

20 **“§ 58126. Recommendations.**

21 The GEDA Board of Directors shall not provide any
22 recommendations to the Governor of Guam without receipt and review of
23 the Review Board’s detailed report as required in §§ 58148.1 and 58148.2.

24 All recommendations of the Authority for issuance, modification, renovation
25 and suspension of Qualifying Certificates shall be forwarded to the
26 Governor of Guam, together with a memorandum of the Authority’s findings
27 in support of its recommendations. Any recommendation of the Authority

1 not approved by the Governor within sixty (60) calendar days from his
2 receipt thereof shall be deemed disapproved on the sixty-first (61st) day
3 following such receipt.”

4 **SECTION 5.** A § 58115(c) of Chapter 58 of Title 12, Guam
5 Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

6 “(c) The Governor of Guam, the Lieutenant Governor of Guam, and
7 their spouses; and person or spouse of such person related by consanguinity
8 of the third degree, which for the purposes of this Section shall include
9 spouses, all children, parents, grandchildren, siblings, grandparents, great-
10 grandchildren, nieces, nephews, uncles, aunts, and great-grandparents, to the
11 Governor and the Lieutenant Governor of Guam;”

12 **SECTION 6. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Act or its
13 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity *shall*
14 *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given
15 effect without the invalid provision or application and to this end the
16 provisions of this Act is severable.

Subject: Unenforced GEDA Rules

1. GUAM ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (GEDA) for their anti-business rules and regulations and written in the charter

Para 58100: LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT:

Para 58110: Conditions of Benefits.

(a) Percentage of Investment: Limiting the tax benefits to a percentage of the capital investment in Guam.

(b) Variable Rate: Varying the rate of tax benefits over the term of the Q.C.

(c) Limitation on Amount. Limiting the tax benefits tax fixed dollar amount

(d) Public Investments: Conditioning the tax benefits on the beneficiary's investing in or creating public improvements separate from its proposed activities.

(e) Local Shareholders: Requiring the Beneficiary to offer ten (10%) per cent or more of its corporate equity to qualified residents of Guam, on terms and conditions to be established by the GEDA Authority.

(f) Profit-Sharing: Requiring the beneficiary to establish profit-sharing and stock ownership programs and other similar benefits (health, life, medical, dental) for its employees.

(g) Training: (ii) make contributions to an independent training or scholarship fund.

(h) Local Purchase. Requiring Beneficiary to procure services or products supplied by Guam-licensed vendors if the total cost does not exceed one hundred ten (110%) percent of the cost of the same services or products available from off-island vendors.

Para 58113: Retroactive suspension: "The suspension, rescission, or revocation of a Q.C. may be retroactive to the time of the act or omission giving rise to the suspension....." (If

arrived at three or four years hence, than all benefits, tax rebates received, will have to be refunded after the fact)

Para 58117: Same Work Force:

(b) Management and non-Management employees: The Authority shall be the sole judge whether a Beneficiary's employee is management or non-management..... Authority shall report to the legislature the titles and compensation of all trainees, including those placed in management levels,"

Para 58118: Same; Wages: "No resident employee of a Beneficiary shall be paid at less than the prevailing wage rate (read GovGuam wages, established by Department of labor) nor shall employee be laid off work nor have his or her workweek reduced to less than forty 40) hours in order"

AN ACT TO *ADD* NEW §§ 58148, 58148.1, 58148.2, 58148.3, AND 58149 TO CHAPTER 58 OF TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AND *AMEND* SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 58 OF TITLE 12 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE QUALIFYING CERTIFICATE REVIEW BOARD, THE QUALIFYING CERTIFICATE ACCOUNTABILITY AND TRANSPARENCY WEBSITE, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

1 **SECTION 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** Pursuant to and in
2 conformance with the practice of the open government laws of Guam, this
3 Act is prescribed by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* for the benefit of Guam resident
4 taxpayers and local businesses operating without the benefits of a Qualifying
5 Certificate, who bear the cost of tax revenues rebated and abated resulting
6 from the granting who bear the loss of tax revenues resulting from the
7 granting of Qualifying Certificates (QCs) by the Guam Economic
8 Development Authority (GEDA).

9 *I Liheslatura* finds that certain companies are granted amendments to
10 the terms and conditions of specific QC requirements without maximum
11 opportunity for internal government and public scrutiny proper scrutiny. The

1 reasons for such actions vary; the most common reason being the company's
2 inability to fulfill contractually binding obligations due to financial or
3 economic hardship.

4 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that for whatever reason
5 amendments to the terms and conditions of the QCs are granted, there are
6 concerns about the government's due diligence during this process and
7 public disclosure and administrative transparency when granting these
8 amendments.

9 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the importance of fulfilling
10 QC obligations, which are binding contractual agreements between the
11 recipient and the people of Guam is paramount, however stricter
12 administrative and enforcement initiatives adopted and performed by the
13 GEDA, is necessary. Improvement of current monitoring and enforcement
14 practices while enhancing the government's ability to responsibly manage
15 QC entitlements, and to prevent any effort to minimize or circumvent the
16 full force and effect of the tax policies of Guam, are essential for maximum
17 positive impact of the QC program.

18 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to establish a
19 Qualifying Certificate Review Board, to review all new applications for
20 Qualifying Certificates, all applications requesting to amend original or
21 amended QCs, and/or all extensions of QCs, and to ensure transparency in
22 the discussions, recommendations, and approval of those applications.
23 Furthermore, it is also the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to create the
24 Qualifying Certificate Accountability and Transparency Website for the sole
25 purpose of increasing accountability and transparency within the Qualifying
26 Certificate Program.

1 **SECTION 2. Establishment of the Qualifying Certificate**
2 **Review Board.** New §§ 58148, 58148.1, 58148.2, and 58148.3 are hereby
3 *added* to Chapter 58 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

4 “§ 58148. **The Qualifying Certificate Review Board.** The
5 Qualifying Certificate Review Board is hereby established, herein referred to
6 as “*Review Board*,” whose members *shall* consist of the Administrator of the
7 Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA), the Director of Revenue
8 and Taxation, the Attorney General of Guam or his/her designee, the Chief
9 Economist of the Department of Labor, and the Chief Economist of the
10 Bureau of Statistics and Plans. The members *shall* convene and elect a
11 Chairperson, and thereafter when called upon by the Chairperson *shall*

20 § 58109, Chapter 58, Title 12 GCA, to the GEDA Board of Directors.

21 § 58148.2. **Applications Requesting Amendments or Extensions of**
22 **Existing Qualifying Certificates.**

23 (a) **Reporting Requirements.** After careful review and scrutiny of the
24 applications to amend original or amended Qualifying Certificates
25 and/or for the extension of the term of existing Qualifying
26 Certificates’ terms and conditions, it *shall* be the duty of the

1 Review Board to provide a detailed report to the GEDA Board of
2 Directors, to include:

- 3 (1). an analysis of the direct impact of the amendment on
4 additional or lost revenue to the government of Guam.
- 5 (2). an analysis of the direct impact of the amendment on Net
6 Profit Margin presented in gross dollars and a percentage
7 taken or calculated in the audit report required in Subsection
8 (c).
- 9 (3). the Net Profit Margin percentage used in Subsection (2)
10 *shall* be compared against a published reasonable industry
11 standard, such as Standard and Poors Key Industry Ratios.
- 12 (4). when amendments reduce requirement thresholds of the
13 recipient, the Review Board *shall* assume the maximum
14 impact.
- 15 (5). the Review Board *shall* submit its report with
16 recommendations and findings to *I Maga'låhen Guåhan, I*
17 *Liheslaturan Guåhan*, and the Board of Directors of the
18 GEDA.

19 (b) Upon receipt of an application to amend or extend an original or
20 amended Qualifying Certificate, the Chairperson of the Review
21 Board *shall* represent the government of Guam in any subsequent
22 discussion, meetings or any other administrative matter(s) or
23 affair(s) that pertain specifically to the amendments or any binding
24 obligation or agreements to an existing Qualifying Certificate.

25 (c) The Administrator of the GEDA *shall* within seven (7) days of its
26 receipt forward to the Chairperson of the Review Board all
27 applications to amend or extend original or amended Qualifying

1 Certificates. The Review Board in processing all applications may
2 recommend amending, reconsidering, suspending and revising all
3 applications to amend original or amended Qualifying Certificate
4 or extension of Qualifying Certificates and *shall* be provided the
5 applicant's audited financial statement by an independent auditor
6 within eighteen (18) months of the date of the application, the
7 terms and conditions of the current Qualifying Certificate and
8 other documents necessary for the preparation of its report and
9 recommendation. The GEDA *shall* further provide the Review
10 Board with complete administrative data, information, record(s),
11 exhibits and correspondence of the applicant(s), which are
12 essential or relevant to the applicant's Qualifying Certificate
13 amendment request.

14 (d) The GEDA *shall* advise all Qualifying Certificate recipients of the
15 provisions contained in this Section and *shall* perform its
16 prescribed administrative obligations accordingly. The provisions
17 of this Section *shall* affect *only* those applicants whose application
18 for amendment, revision, or extension is received after April 30,
19 2013.

20 (e) Notwithstanding any other laws, procedures or rules and
21 regulations of the government of Guam applicable to the
22 Qualifying Certificate program established pursuant to Chapter 58
23 of Title 12 GCA, the provisions of this Section *shall* serve to
24 lawfully augment the existing policies of Guam, which relate to the
25 amendment of original and amended terms and conditions of
26 Guam's Qualifying Certificate Program.

1 **§ 58148.3. Review Board Meetings.** The Review Board *shall* provide
2 public notification pursuant to the Open Government Law, Chapter 8, Title 5
3 GCA, of all meetings scheduled to review and discuss the applications
4 submitted. Review Board meetings *shall* include a public hearing component
5 pursuant to the Administration Adjudication Law and the Open Government
6 Law.

7 (a) For applications for new Qualifying Certificates, the Review Board
8 *shall* cause to be performed, all required publication of
9 applications and public notices to be at the expense of the
10 applicant, pursuant to Chapter 58, Title 12 GCA. The GEDA’s
11 staff *may* be utilized to perform the duties required in this
12 Subsection (a).

13 (b) The individual, corporation, business or entity requesting
14 amendments or extensions to a Qualifying Certificate *shall* pay for
15 the cost of the public notification and any audits, if necessary, at
16 such amounts as determined by the Review Board.”

17 **SECTION 3. Creation of the Qualifying Certificate**
18 **Accountability and Transparency Website.** A new § 58149 is hereby
19 *added* to Chapter 58 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

20 **“§ 58149. The Qualifying Certificate Accountability and**
21 **Transparency Website.** The GEDA shall create, or cause to be created, the
22 Qualifying Certificate Accountability and Transparency Website (Q-CAT
23 Website) for the sole purpose of increasing accountability and transparency
24 in the Qualifying Certificate Program. Funding for the Q-CAT Website is
25 hereby continuously appropriated from the annual Qualifying Certificate
26 Program fees charged and collected by the GEDA. The Q-CAT Website
27 shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- 1 (a) Electronic copies of all new applications for Qualifying
2 Certificates within fifteen (15) days of receipt of said
3 application(s).
- 4 (b) Electronic copies of all applications to amend original or amended
5 Qualifying Certificates and/or for the extension of the term of
6 existing Qualifying Certificates' terms and conditions within
7 fifteen (15) days of receipt of said application(s).
- 8 (c) Electronic copies of the monthly reports required to be submitted
9 pursuant to § 58123, Chapter 58, Title 12 GCA within fifteen (15)
10 days of receipt of said report.
- 11 (d) All notices of hearings required in § 58125, Chapter 58, Title 12
12 GCA.
- 13 (e) All recommendations made by the GEDA Board of Directors
14 pursuant to § 58126 to the Governor within five (5) days of making
15 such recommendation.

16 The GEDA is required to create, or cause to be created, the Q-CAT
17 Website within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Act.”

18 **SECTION 4.** A § 58126 of Chapter 58 of Title 12, Guam Code
19 Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

20 **“§ 58126. Recommendations.**

21 The GEDA Board of Directors shall not provide any
22 recommendations to the Governor of Guam without receipt and review of
23 the Review Board’s detailed report as required in §§ 58148.1 and 58148.2.

24 All recommendations of the Authority for issuance, modification, renovation
25 and suspension of Qualifying Certificates shall be forwarded to the
26 Governor of Guam, together with a memorandum of the Authority’s findings
27 in support of its recommendations. Any recommendation of the Authority

1 not approved by the Governor within sixty (60) calendar days from his
2 receipt thereof shall be deemed disapproved on the sixty-first (61st) day
3 following such receipt.”

4 **SECTION 5.** A § 58115(c) of Chapter 58 of Title 12, Guam
5 Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

6 “(c) The Governor of Guam, the Lieutenant Governor of Guam, and
7 their spouses; and person or spouse of such person related by consanguinity
8 of the third degree, which for the purposes of this Section shall include
9 spouses, all children, parents, grandchildren, siblings, grandparents, great-
10 grandchildren, nieces, nephews, uncles, aunts, and great-grandparents, to the
11 Governor and the Lieutenant Governor of Guam;”

12 **SECTION 6. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Act or its
13 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity *shall*
14 *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given
15 effect without the invalid provision or application and to this end the
16 provisions of this Act is severable.
