Dear Madam Speaker,

Attached is Bill No. 234 -32 (COR), *An act to add a new subsection (j) to §20204.1 of Article 2, Chapter 20, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to requiring that the Office of Technology establish a protocol to back-up critical electronic data necessary for the efficient operation of government of Guam agencies, which I have vetoed.*

There is no dispute that the government's valuable electronic data must be protected and safeguarded. Having secure back-up storage of data is, and should be, a priority of every agency and the government as a whole.

However, Bill 234-32 is redundant because the provisions of the bill are already covered by Public Law 32-10, a measure that was introduced by Sen. Tommy Morrison and supported by Sen. Michael San Nicolas. More to the point, there is already a guiding policy on the matter, and my administration is ensuring that the proper protocols are in place to safeguard sensitive electronic data with the government of Guam. Finally, Bill 234-32 represents yet another mandate with no identifiable source of funds.


