

1 "(2) Twenty-nine Million Five Hundred Four Thousand Dollars 2 (\$29,504,000) to fund the capital expense items and capital improvement projects of the Department of Education needed to comply with the Every 3 Child is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education Act as listed in 4 5 Attachments A and A-1. Effective October 23, 2014, the Superintendent of 6 Education is authorized to expend the remaining funds for facilities repair, 7 and air conditioning and equipment repair and replacement for public 8 schools."

9 Section 9. The sum of Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) is 10 hereby appropriated from the SAR Fund to the Guam Economic Development 11 Authority for the Guam Football Association for the development of gymnasium 12 and classroom sports facilities in the northern part of the island.

Funding *shall only* be disbursed as a matching grant of private funds secured by the Guam Football Association pursuant to Chapter 77, Article 3, Title 12 GCA. The Guam Football Association *shall* submit to the Guam Economic Development Authority evidence of matching grant funds secured prior to certification of funds for disbursement, project plan(s), and subsequent invoices for project(s) funded by said appropriation.

Section 10. Effective Date. This Act *shall* be effective upon enactment.

Section 11. Severability. *If* any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application and to this end the provisions of this Act is severable.
